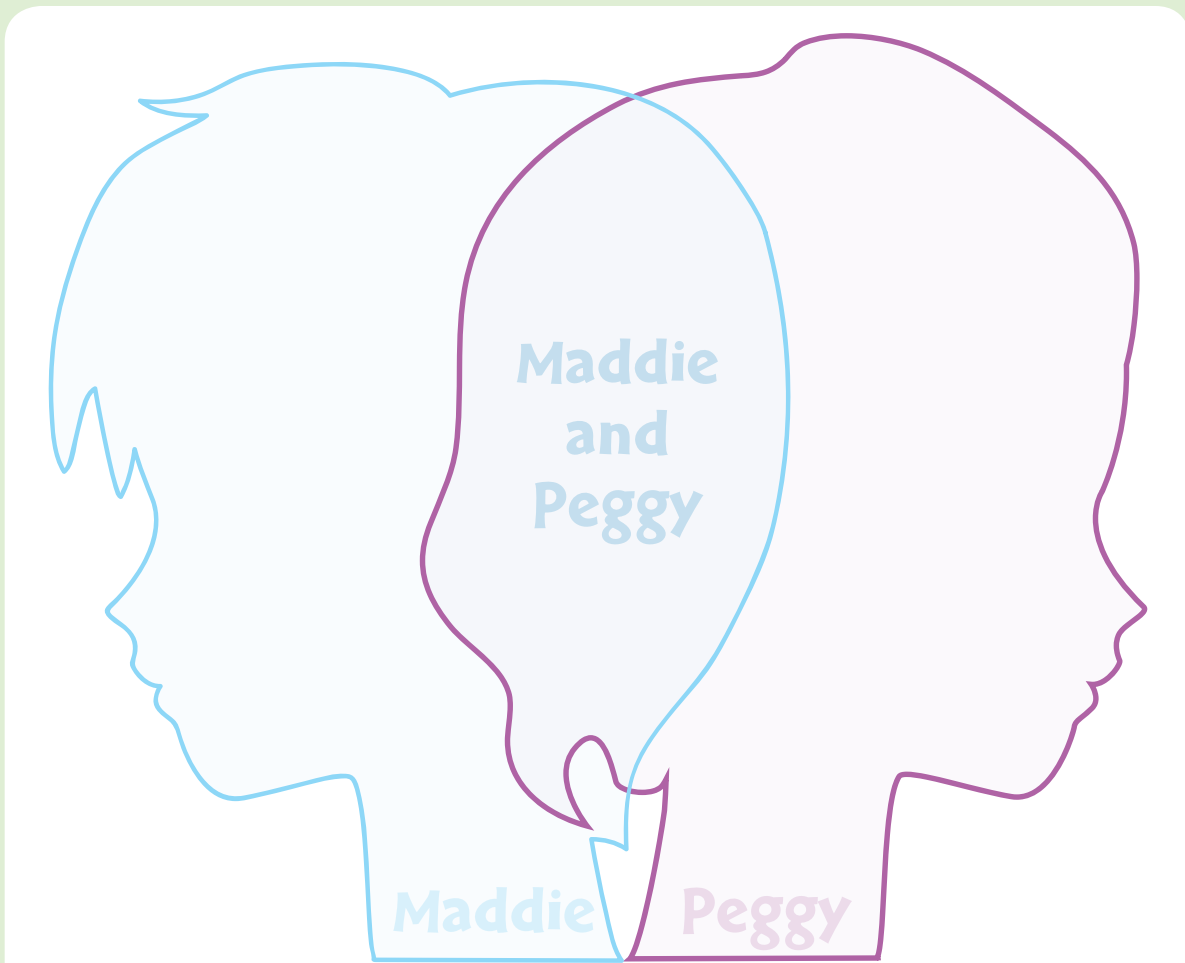


# Character Comparisons

1. Peggy and Maddie were late for school because they were waiting to tease Wanda. But Wanda was away on that day. No one seemed to notice she wasn't there.



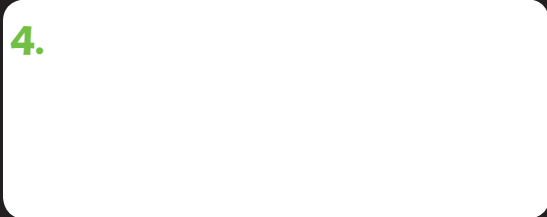
