
Describing Wheel



Choose a topic or theme addressed in *Romeo and Juliet* (i.e. violence and death; love and passion; the role of families in love and marriage).

Place the theme in the center circle, then add describing words about your topic between the spokes. The describing words may be from the play, or other words that you feel are appropriate.

i.e. Topic: *love/romance*. Describing words: *passionate, fatal, all-consuming, star-crossed, family feud, etc.*
