Asia - Place

sia is a vast continent with many features that make it unique from all the other continents. What are these unique features? Its **physical characteristics** make it unique. The **people** of Asia, where they have chosen to live, and the languages that they speak make it unique. The **wildlife** of Asia also makes it unique. Each of these features helps us better understand Asia and describe it as a **place**.



Asia is a **continent** of surprising contrasts. There are huge cities throughout the continent, filled with millions of people, and there are wide, **barren** stretches of land where very few people choose to live. There are some of the tallest mountains in the world, and some low lying areas, like the Dead Sea, that are **below sea level**. The northern parts of Russia are icy cold, while the rainforests of Southeast Asia are hot and humid. This variety of physical characteristics is pan of what makes Asia unique as a place.



The people of Asia are as varied as its physical characteristics. From Turkey in the west, to Japan in the east, there are hundreds of peoples, cultures, and languages throughout Asia, Well over half of the Earth's entire population lives in Asia! India and China each have more than one billion people! Many people live in **rural** areas, farming and working the land. Many others live in large cities with dense populations.

Many of Asia's largest cities are on large bodies of water. Hong Kong, Mumbai, Jeddah, and Tokyo all have large ports on the sea that allow them to trade easily by ship with other parts of the world. Cities like Seoul and Delhi were built on rivers that allowed both travelers and traders to visit them easily.


