The first step in prewriting for a good descriptive essay is planning. Your planning should include:

1. choosing a topic (if you are given a choice);

2. gathering information about the topic; and

3. using a graphic organizer to map out the structure of the descriptive essay.

It is very important to remember that descriptive essays should contain colorful language. Try to use as many **adjectives** as you can in your essay. Descriptive essays do not tell a story, convince someone to think a
