To hint at something that will happen later

Flashback

To refer back to an event that has already taken place

Symbolism

When an object stands for a feeling, idea, or concept

Irony

To express the opposite of its exact meaning

Flashback Timeline

Jacob has a **softball tournament** this weekend. He has been **practicing** for it the last two weeks. Yesterday, his team got together for their **last practice**. Tomorrow he plans to **practice on his own**. If Jacob's team **wins the tournament**, they will receive trophies and go out for pizza. Jacob has been **playing softball** since he was ten.
