- 1. As a student reads the story aloud, classmates **perform sound effects** (as agreed upon before reading begins).
- 2. Introducing Students read the title, author and a favorite part of the story on to an audio tape. When presenting, play the tape and the student may show the picture that goes with that part.
- 3. Dress Up Character Day: Have a dress-up day for small groups or for the whole class. Classmates try to guess the names of characters.
- 4. Silly Songs: Make up a silly song about a laterters, plot using a familiar tune. E.g. (tune "Row, Row, Row Your Loo")

- 5. Make a Sing Mars Book using Silly Songs.
- 6. Play appropriate background music while student gives book talk.
- 7. Pantomime: List three events in the story. Act out an event in the story. Ask classmates to guess which one was being shown.
- 8. Use rhythm bands instruments to provide background music.
- **9.** Use **voice** to convey tone and expression while reading dialog from the story.
- 10. Make up a chant to tell about the story.
