The Role of the Navy

W Reading Passage

he Navy also played a very important role in the U.S. war effort in Vietnam. The Navy had three major jobs. The first was to stop the flow of supplies by sea from North Vietnam from getting to communist troops in the South. The second was to provide artillery support from the big ships' guns. The artillery fire protected troops under attack as well as bombarded North Vietnamese and Viet Cong



positions and bunkers. The third was to use smaller and faster boats to police and patrol the vast inland waterways and rivers. As well as patrolling the waterways, the Navy used the rivers to provide quick transport of troops and supplies into hard to reach areas. Naval forces in Vietnam were divided into two forces called the Blue Water Navy and the Brown Water Navy. The Blue Water Navy patrolled the deep waters off the coast of Vietnam and included battleships, cruisers, destroyers and the first nuclear-powered aircraft carrier, the U.S.S. Enterprise. The Brown Water Navy used patrol gunboats and other fast ships and boats to cruise the inland rivers and coastal seas. Brown water referred to the brown murky color of the waters that covered the country.


Who patrolled the deep waters off the coast of Vietnam?


The Special Force s branch of the Navy were called SEAL teams. (SEAL stood for Sea, Air and Land). SEAL teams were usually small units that went on covert or secret missions to gather information, conduct ambushes, capture Viet Cong agents or rescue POW's (Prisoner of War). They were highly trained and performed many dangerous missions in the Mekong Delta and elsewhere in Vietnam.




