The War at Home

ar is never a popular thing. The Vietnam War greatly divided the American people. As the United States became more involved in Vietnam, and more troops were being killed, anti war feelings began to grow. All across the country there were protests, marches and rallies. People started to question the government's motives and reasons for being in Vietnam. The majority



of American people supported the president, but they also needed a reason for why so many American lives were being sacrificed in Vietnam.

There were famous marches and protests during the war. One protest in October of 1967 brought more than 100,000 people to Washington, D.C. The protestors marched on the Pentagon and were slopped by armed U.S. soldiers. Protestors put flowers in soldiers' gun barrels. Another infamous protest occurred in May 1970 at Kent State University. After demonstrations turned violent, the National Guard was called in. During the protest the National Guard fired into the crowd of over 2000 people, and four people were killed.



What did protesters put in soldiers' gun barrels?

The Vietnam War was the longest military conflict in U.S. history. By the end of the war more than 58,000 Americans had been killed and another 304,000 had been wounded. It is estimated that 3 to 4 million Vietnamese people on both sides were killed. It is believed that the financial cost of the war for the U.S. was close to \$150 billion dollars.
