

#### **Remembering the War**

hen the Vietnam War ended there were many issues facing the American people and veterans that returned home. The nation had been greatly divided over Vietnam and needed healing. Combat Veterans who came home felt unappreciated by the



country and the ideal they had fought for They were often treated poorly. Many veterans dealt with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). It is a mental disorder caused when a person experiences something life-threatening or traumatic like combat. Many veterans couldn't deal with the drastic changes and life-altering events they witnessed in Vietnam and had a hard time returning to everyday life back in the United States. Many dealt with debilitating injuries and a changed society that scorned Vietnam veterans- soldiers who did nothing but long to return home after experiencing the horrors of war in a totally foreign and alien country. Even Hollywood, with films like Rambo, Platon, Appealypse Now and Full Metal Jacket have shown the more negative sides of the war. They portray American troops as lazy and uncaring, as well as focusing on other problems like a widespread lack of discipline, rampant drug use by troops, and atrocities that were committed against the enemy and Vietnamese civilians.

Another issue facing the United States after the war was the return of Prisoners of War (POW's) and soldiers listed as missing in action (MIA's). American troops and servicemen that were captured


