

hen we talk about a place's location, we can describe it in two different ways. A place's absolute location tells exactly where it is. When we describe a place's relative **location**, we describe the things around it and the things that connect it to other places.

We can easily describe the absolute location of a city like San Francisco. We do this by using **latitude** and **longitude**. San Francisco has an exact location of



North America's relative location is in the Western **Hemisphere**, north of the Equator. North America is east of Europe, west of Asia, and north of South America. Several oceans surround North America. To the north lies the Arctic Ocean, the Pacific Ocean to the west, and the Atlantic Ocean to the east. These oceans provide links between North America and the other cont



North America's location gives it many different climates. In its most northerly point, in the Canadian territory of Nunavut, the temperatures rarely go above 32° F (0° C). In its most southerly point, in the country of Panama, the climate is that of a tropical rainforest! And in between these two extremes, a wide variety of different climates can be found.






