H
ow can we describe where a place is located? We can describe exactly where a place is by giving its absolute location. We can do this by looking at where lines of latitude and longitude cross on a map. We might describe the things around it and the things that connect it to other places. This kind of description is called relative location.
Antarctica is very easy to find on a map or on a globe. Just look for the South Pole! If we used latitude to describe its location, we could say that all of Antarctica is south of $60^{\circ}$ S latitude. Wou where it is?
