ince the United States is a democracy, all of its government leaders are elected, or chosen by the citizens. The Constitution states all the requirements for each federal office. These must be fulfilled before a person can run for the office. A candidate for President or Vice-President of the United States must: (1) be a citizen born in the United States, (2) be at least 35 years old, and (3) have lived in the United States for the last fourteen years. The office of the vice-president is also very important because the vice-president is the person who takes over as president if something happens that makes the president unable to serve. The Constifution also sets the term limits for all federal offices. The President can only serve two consecutive terms (a total of eight years). The presidential elections are held every four years. Elections for the Senate are held every six years and those for the Hou esentatives are held every two years. A person who runs for a political office
