

Three Branches of the Mexican Government

he authors of the Constitution of 1917 decided that a government divided into three parts would be much fairer than a government with just one part. They did not want one person or group to hold all the power. This idea is called **separation of powers**. They gave the new Mexican government three branches. Each one would have its own jobs and responsibilities.

The branches of the government of the United Mexican States are: the legislative, executive, and judicial. The Constitution of 1917 describes the duties that each branch has and the titles of the people who carry out these duties. Each branch must follow the Constitution of 1917 at all times. The headquarters for each branch of government is in Mexico City, D.F. ("Distrito Federal"), the nation's capital.

The **Executive Branch** makes sure that the laws of the country are obeyed and that the Constitution of 1917 is followed. The **President** is the head of the executive branch. **Chapter III** of the Third Title of the **Constitution** describes the duties of the executive branch. There is no vice-president in Mexican government. The president is assisted by his **cabinet**. The cabinet is made up of **18 Secretaries of State**, the head of the federal executive legal office, and the **Attorney General**. The president is elected for one six-year term, called a **sexenio**.

Chapter III of the Third Title of the Mexican Constitution states that, for one to run for President of Mexico, a person must be: 1) a Mexican citizen by birth, with a father and mother who are Mexican by birth, who has resided in the country for at least 20 years; 2) 35 years old, or older, at the time of the election; 3) a resident in the country for the entire year before the election; 4) not an official of any church or religious denomination; 5) not in active military service during the six months before the election; 6) not a secretary or under-secretary of state, attorney general, or governor of a state for at least six months before the election and; 7) never been president already (by election, or other causes).

Tagk #5 The Mexican president has many powers. Think about what you have learned about the Mexican government and describe three of the powers the Mexican president has. What document gives him these powers?


The Constitution of 1917 states that slavery is forbidden in Mexico. What is slavery? What basic rights are taken away from a person who is a slave to another person or group of people?
