

What two problems did Fox try to fix when he became **President?**

Before Fox took office, Mexico was not very involved in world politics. They had a strict rule that said Mexico should not criticize how other governments decide to run their countries. Fox decided to increase Mexico's involvement in world politics.

Fox worked with the U.S. to fry to control open immigration between the Mexico-U.S. borders. George Waush supported these discussions, but no new laws were passed in the

other Latin American countries. Mexico held several international summits to talk about global issues. Guests included Fidel Castro and George W. Bush. The two leaders were not in the same room at the same time, but Fox wanted to help the two leaders work together.






