








Juan and Eva Peron

Juan Peron was a three time President of Argentina. His wife, Eva, was a powerful leader who worked with her husband. They are still very popular figures in Argentina today.

Eva Peron

Before he became President, Juan was a colonel in the military, Minister of War, and Vice-President of Argentina. The Perons had several goals that they worked towards together during his Presidency. They wanted to **eliminate** poverty. They also wanted to give power to the working class. Their goals angered the **wealthy** people who did not want to see the working class get richer.

Why were the wealthy people of Argentina unhappy with the Perons?



Eva Peron was one of the most powerful women of her time. She was **recognized** as a leader within her husband's **organization**. Eva was a very **ambitious** woman. She traveled to Europe on the "Rainbow Tour". On the tour, she met with many European leaders.

When Juan Peron ran for a second time, Eva wanted to be his Vice-President. The military was against the idea of a woman as Vice-President. Besides, Eva quickly became too sick for the job. She died shortly after her husband won the election.

Juan and Eva Peron were **controversial** leaders. Many people loved them. Other people accused them of spending too much money. The Perons have also been **linked** to former Nazis. Many former Nazis **fled** to Argentina.

The Perons are still considered to be heroes by many in Argentina.

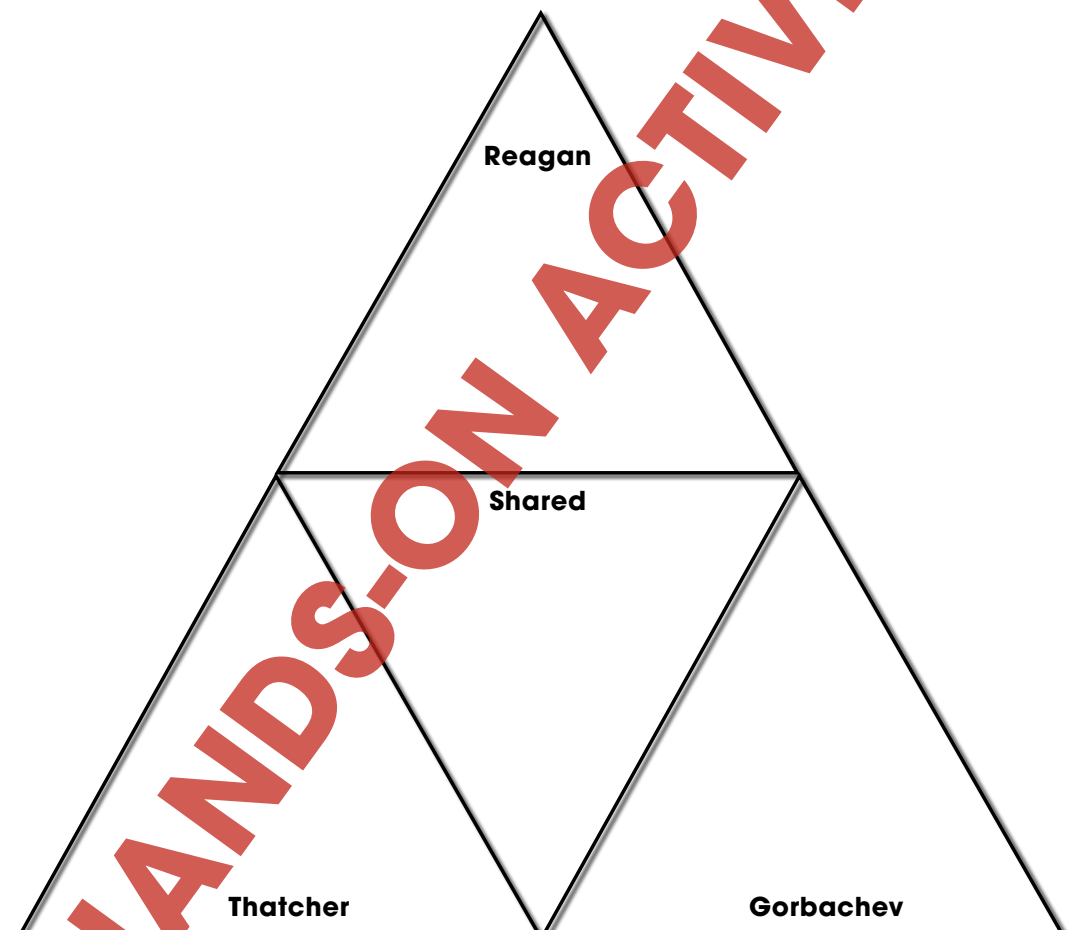

Using the Pyramid below, describe how Reagan, Thatcher, and Gorbachev are similar to and different from each other.





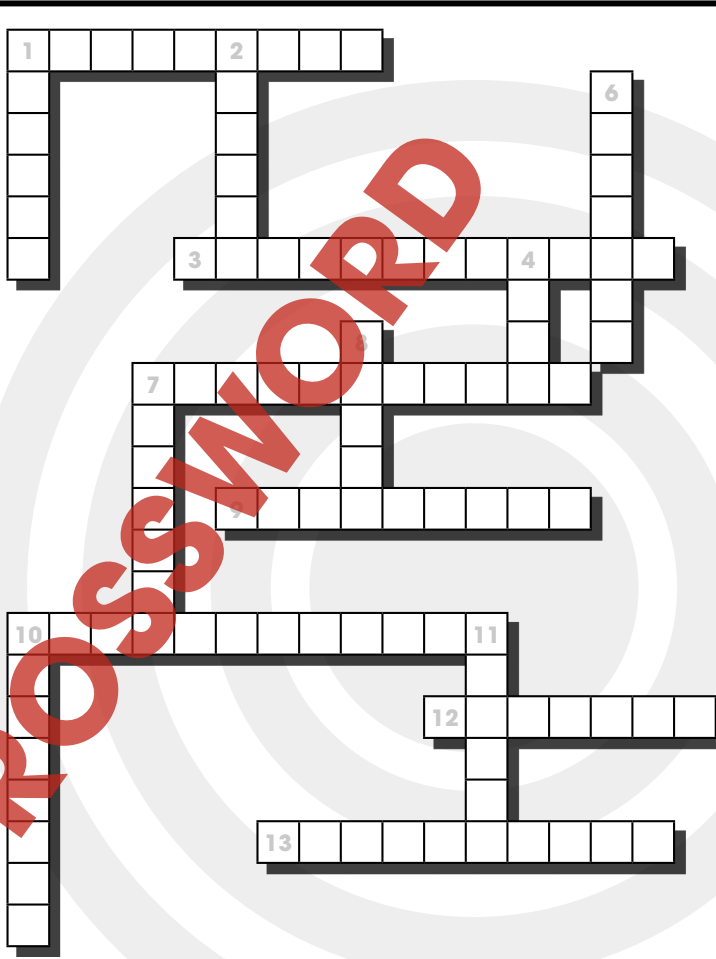

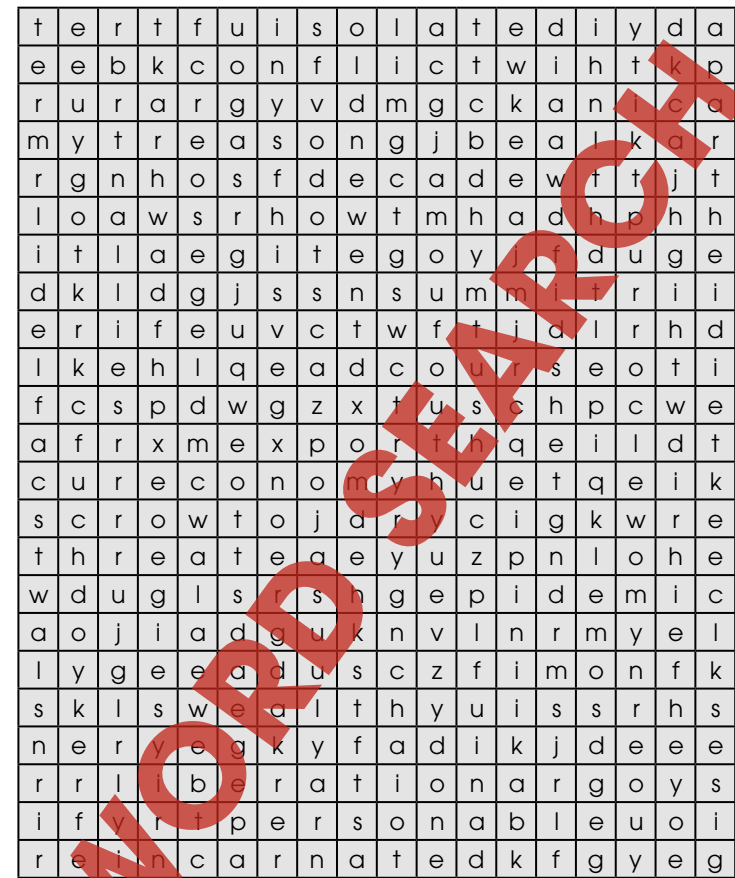

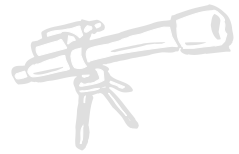
