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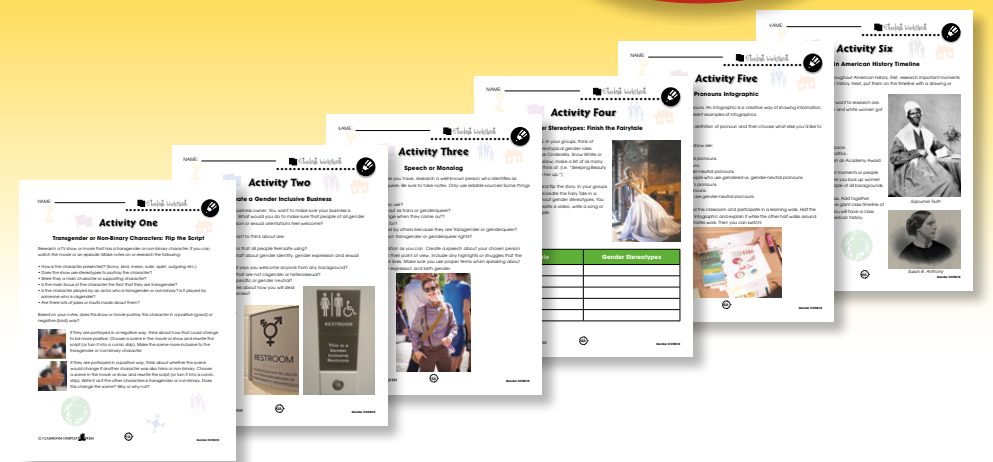

What is Genderqueer or Non-Binary?

Think back to our gender spectrum from our What is Gender? chapter. When a person begins to realize their gender identity, they may feel that they fit at the 'boy' end of the spectrum or the 'girl' end of the spectrum. But there are some people that may not feel completely like a boy or not completely like a girl.

More info

There are many terms to describe someone's gender identity. Genderqueer and non-binary are just two of them!

These people would fall somewhere in the middle of the spectrum. This means that they don't feel like they fit into the category of boy or girl. Two common terms to describe these people are **genderqueer** and **non-binary**.



Gender identity is our personal feeling of being a boy or a girl or something in between.

People who are genderqueer or non-binary are often treated unfairly. This is because people see them as different. Sometimes they face challenges that cisgender people don't.

Comparing 'Boy' vs. 'Girl' Magazines

- Who looks more active or athletic in the advertisements: boys or girls?
- Do you think these advertisements are true for what all boys and all girls want?
- Do you think the products being advertised are representative of what all girls or boys want?
- Do these ads make you feel like you are supposed to buy certain things because of your gender?
- Would any of you rather buy something that is advertised for the opposite gender?
- How do you think these stereotypes of what boys and girls want can be harmful to children who see the magazines?

Now, on your own, make your own magazine or advertisement that doesn't use stereotypes. It should show boys and girls using a variety of different things. Be as creative as you can!
