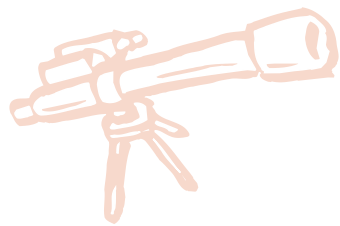

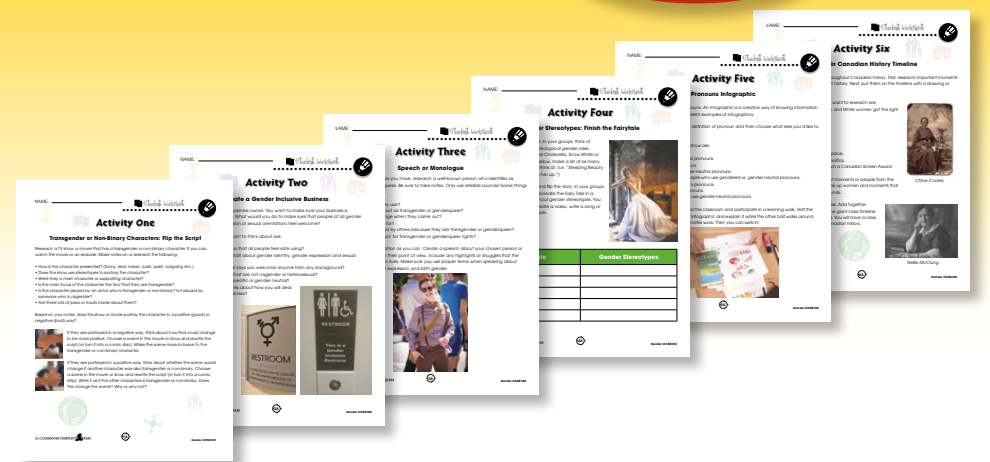

Sexual orientation means who we are romantically attracted to. People usually expect men to be attracted to women and women to be attracted to men. However, there are many men and women who are not. Some women are attracted to other women. Some men are attracted to other men. Some people are attracted to both men and women.

Gender identity is a feeling. So is sexual orientation. We can't help who we are attracted to or who we love—it just happens!

People who are attracted to the opposite gender are known as **straight**, or **heterosexual**. Those who are attracted to the same gender are known as **gay**, or **homosexual**. A person who is attracted to both men and women is known as **bisexual**. People who are not straight are often treated unfairly. This is because many people see it as 'normal' to be attracted to the opposite gender. All human beings deserve equal respect.

It's important to remember that there are many sexual orientations. Gay, straight and bisexual are just three of them. Some others are lesbian, pansexual and asexual.

Sexual orientation isn't simple. Some people do not 'fit' into the three orientations on this spectrum. It is a unique feeling. People may use other words to describe their orientation.

Once completed, present your e-mail to the class.

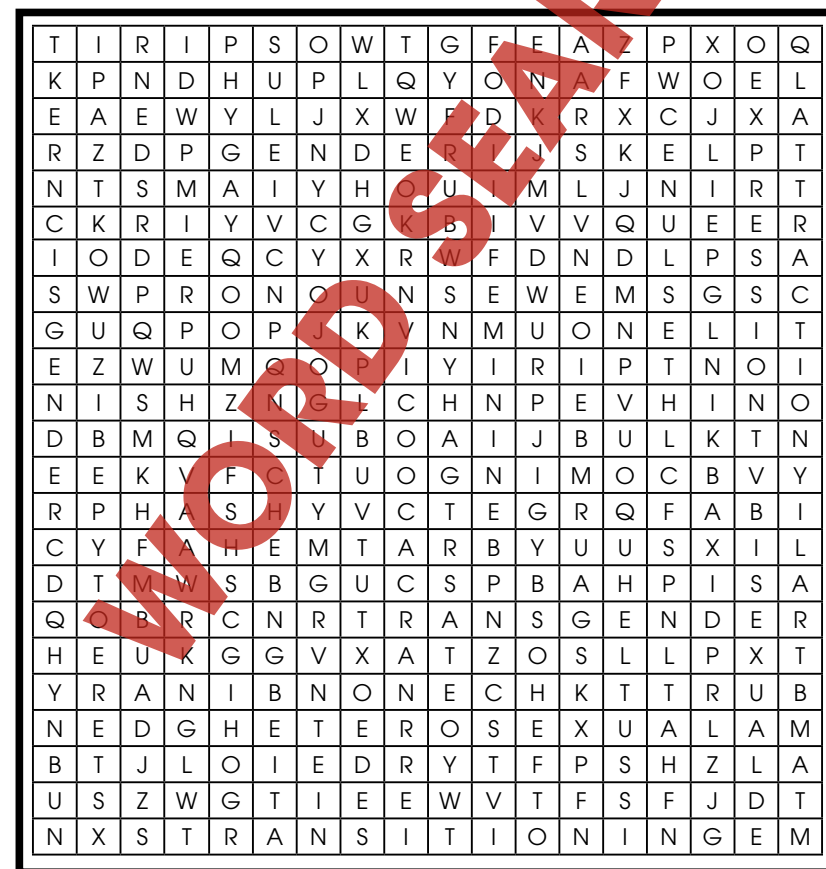

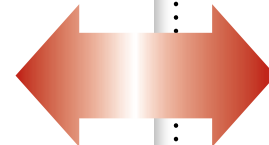
