KEY TERM: 'Oppressed' means that a certain group of people are treated unfairly. Usually this is by the people in control.

Throughout history, women have been oppressed in their communities in comparison to men. This is because at one time, men were thought to be the stronger gender. They also had control. After fighting for many years, women got to vote in Canada. This happened in 1918. This was over 50 years after men were allowed to vote!

Some groups of women are more oppressed than others. Two examples are Black Canadian and Indigenous women. These groups are often treated unfairly for two reasons. First, because of their ethnicity. Second, because of their

Write an E-Mail to Your Grandparents




