How is Sexual Orientation Different Than Gender?

Who we are attracted to does not depend on our own gender. Some people believe that girls are <u>only</u> attracted to boys. They believe that boys are <u>only</u> attracted to girls. This isn't true. There are many girls who are romantically attracted to their own gender. There are many boys who are romantically attracted to their own gender.

Our orientation is a personal feeling. It is about other people. Our **identity** is also a personal feeling. However, it is about ourselves. A **cisgender** person can be attracted to all genders. A **transgender** person can also be attracted to all genders. Your identity does not decide who you are attracted to.

Remember: Does a person's identity match their assigned sex?






