

You may have seen the acronym "LGBTQ2S+". These letters stand for **Lesbian**, **Gay**, **Bisexual**, Transgender, Queer, and Two-Spirit. This term stands for all orientations and identities that are not cisgender or heterosexual. The plus sign (+) stands for others that aren't included in the acronym!



Some people don't feel that they fit into any other orientation or identity. They are known


