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

Rights for the LGBTQ2S+ community have only existed in recent years. Same-gender marriage only became legal in 2015. Adoption by same-gender parents was only allowed in 2017. In fact, there are many basic rights that LGBTQ2S+ still don't have in America. Discrimination against LGBTQ2S+ people was once the norm. It would still be that way today if it weren't for some very important people.



"How many years has it taken people to realize that we are all brothers and sisters and human beings in the human race?" - Marsha P. Johnson

One of those people is **Marsha P. Johnson**. Marsha was a Black transgender woman. She fought for LGBTQ2S+ rights during the Stonewall Riots. She refused to back down to police when they raided the Stonewall Inn. This was the first major time anyone had stood up against the police. This made her an icon within the LGBTQ2S+ community. She was an advocate that risked her own safety to fight for LGBTQ2S+ rights. She bravely continued this fight until she died in 1992.




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
