

Thomas Jefferson was a very smart man. Even as a child, he studied for many hours every day. Science, history, law, politics, and even farming were an important part of his studies. He could speak six different languages. Thomas was interested in learning as much as possible, which led to his having many jobs. He was a farmer at his beautiful home, called Monticello, which he designed himself. He was a violinist who practiced for hours at a time. Thomas was also an inventor who loved to create new tools to help make work around the house much easier.

When he was 26 years old, Thomas was elected to the Virginia government. At this time, trouble between the American colonies and Britain was growing. Thomas wrote many articles and letters about these problems. Because of his great writing skills, Thomas was later asked to write the Declaration of Independence. It told of the colonies' wish to break free from British rule. In the declaration, Thomas wrote about the rights that should be given to all people, including "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness."

When George Washington was elected the first President of the United States, he chose Thomas to be his Secretary of State. A few years later, John Adams became the second President and Thomas was his Vice President. Finally, in 1801, Thomas Jefferson himself was elected as the third President of the United States.

During his two terms in office, President Jefferson nearly doubled the size of the United States. In the early 1800s, much of the land east of the Mississippi River was owned
