George worked on his father's 1992 presidential campaign, and decided to try politics himself. In 1994, George ran for governor of Texas. He won, and had many successes during his first term. He improved the education system in Texas. He also made big changes to healthcare. He was such a popular governor that no candidate wanted to run against him, and Bush was easily reelected.

In 2000, Bush ran for president of the United States against Vice President Al Gore. It turned out to be one of the most debated elections in history. The day after the election, it was unclear who had won. Votes in Florida had to be recounted. Legal battles between the two parties went before the Supreme Court. In the end, Bush was awarded the presidency.

On September 11, 2001, the United States was attacked by terrorists. President Bush sent troops into Afghanistan to fight the terrorist group that led the attacks and the government that helped them. In the U.S., President Bush established the Department of Homeland Security and passed laws to protect America from any more attacks.

In 2003, President Bush sent U.S. troops into Iraq. He believed that Saddam Hussein, the dictator in charge of the Iraqi government, had weapons that could harm the United States. Within weeks, the Iraqi military was defeated. Hussein was taken out of power. But many Iraqis wanted the U.S. out of their country, and they continued to attack American troops. The war continued, and what appeared to be an easy victory became a long, hard fight.

President Bush accomplished many things while in office. He provided aid to struggling countries in Africa. He worked hard to improve education in the U.S. He created better conditions for the elderly. Bush was elected to a second term in office, and served as president until January of 2009.
