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
Word Strings

Cognitive Thinking Strategies: Association, Convergent Thinking, Divergent Thinking


The **Word Strings** activity is an excellent way to empower students' creativity. Students start with a single word, and then string along words they associate with the previous word.

Here is an example of a word string:


Give students the first word. Then ask, "What is the first word that comes to your mind when you think of this word?" They should write down the word they associate with this first word. Repeat the process several times. Students should be able to explain how their words are connected. This is a fun and inspiring thinking activity that helps students understand their own thought processes. Students can also use drawings to form picture-strings.


