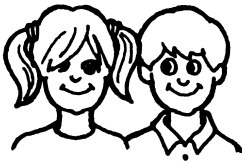
# Nouns and Sentence Subjects

*A noun names a person, place, or thing. A noun that names one person, place, or thing is **singular**. A noun that names more than one is a **plural noun**.*



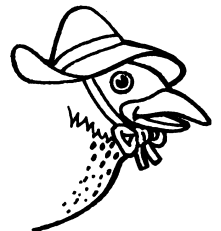

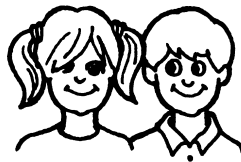


Robin's rule:

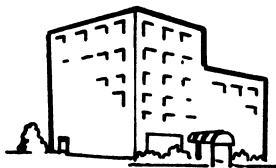
*A sentence has a noun to tell who or what the sentence is about. This noun is in the part of the sentence called the **subject**.*



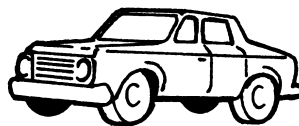

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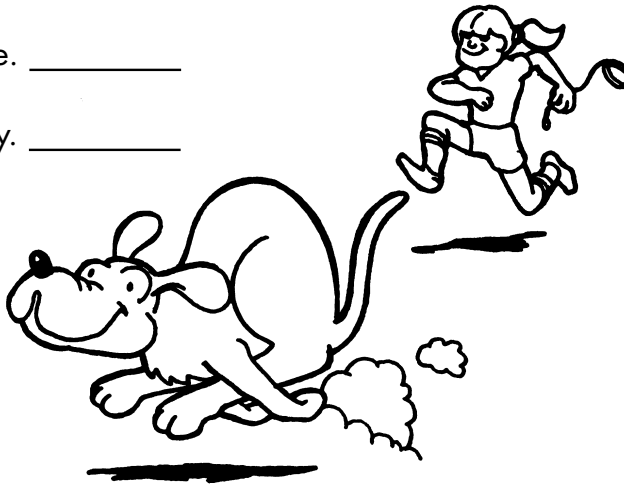

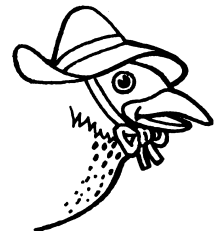
Robin's rule:

*A **verb** usually shows action. It tells what the noun is doing or did. The **verb** is in the part of the sentence that tells something about the subject. This part is called the **predicate**.*

Underline the predicate in each sentence. Be sure to include the verb.

**Example:** Robin flew into the tall tree.
