A noun names a person, place, or thing. Any word that will complete this sentence is a noun: **I see the _____.**

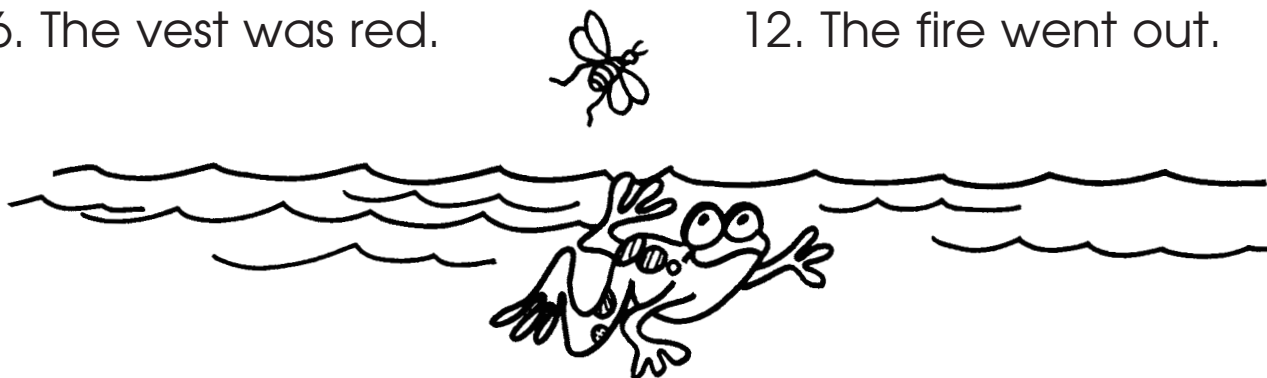

place = library, park

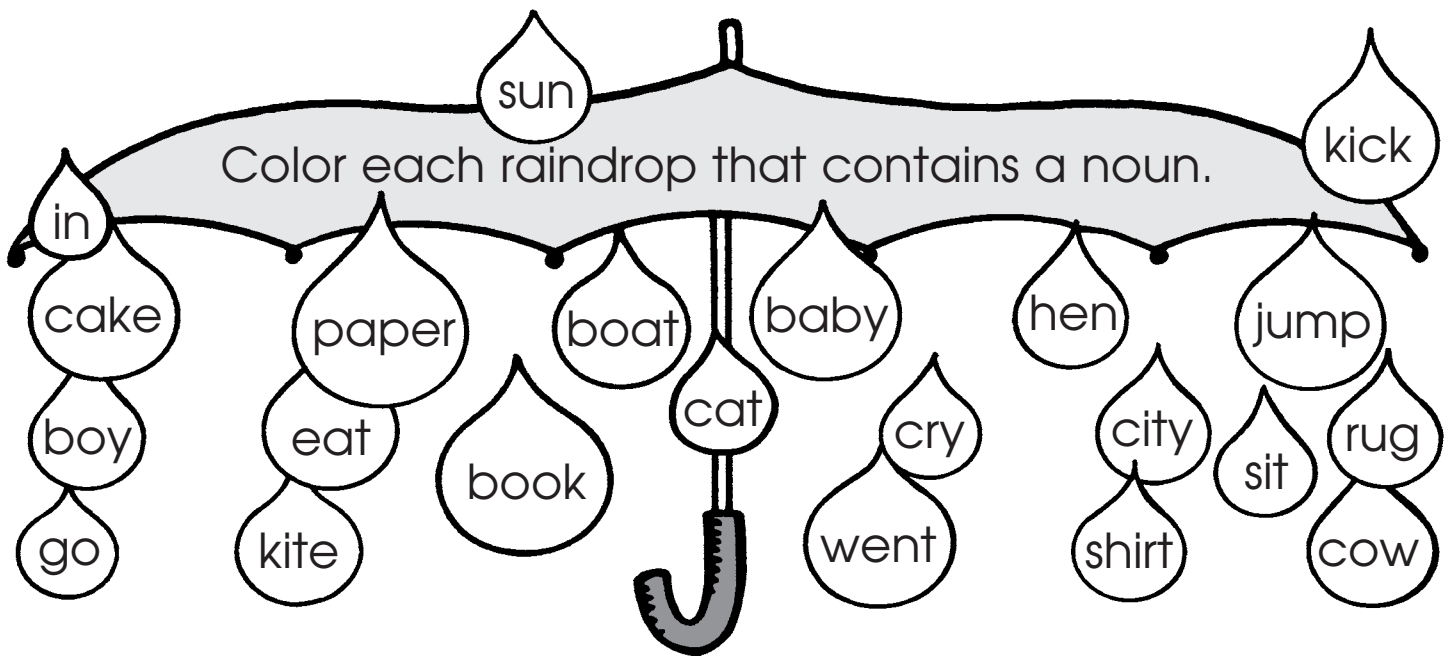
