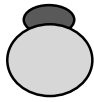
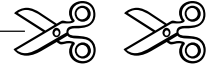

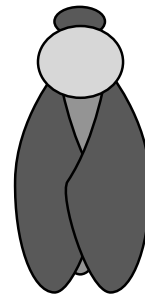
AMERICAN ROACH



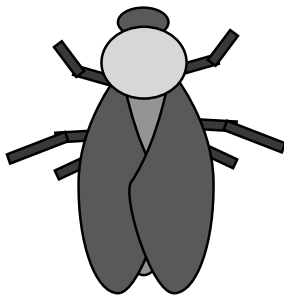
1 Cut one #1 head from red or rust colored paper. Cut one #2 body from yellow or tan colored paper and glue as shown.



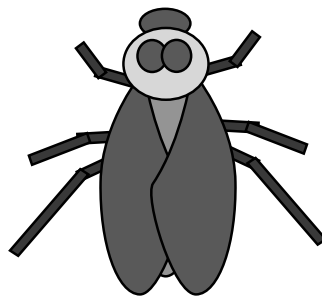
2 Cut one #3 tail from gray or black paper and glue to the back side of the body.



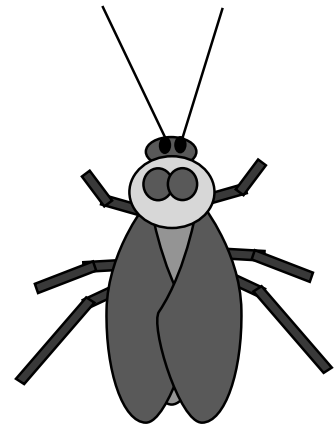
3 Cut two #4 wings from red or rust colored paper and glue as shown.



4 Cut eight #6 legs from black paper for the front part of the body and the start of the back legs as shown and glue in place.



5 Cut two #7 legs from black paper to complete the back legs. Cut two #5 circles from red or rust colored paper and glue to the main body as shown.

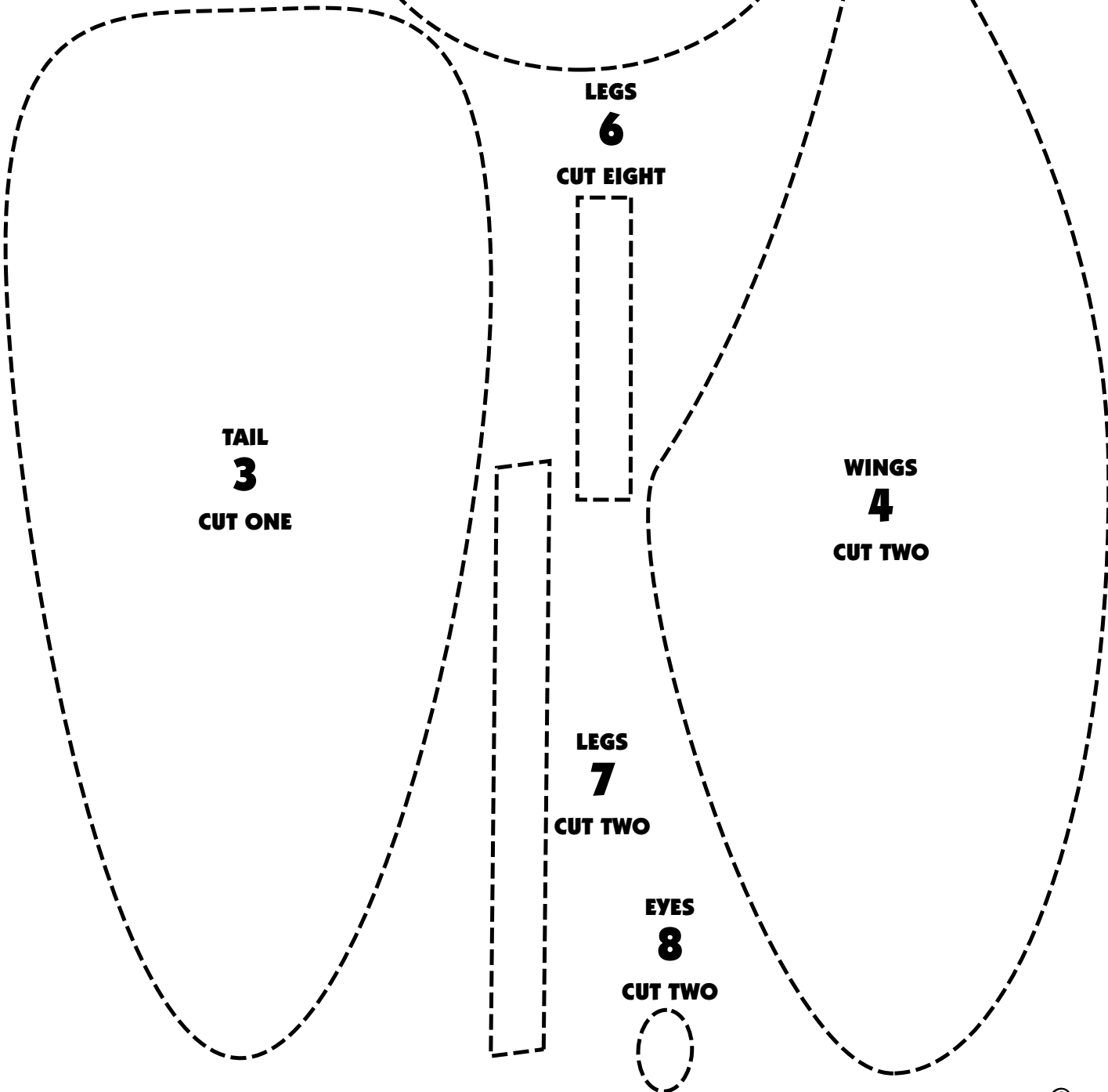
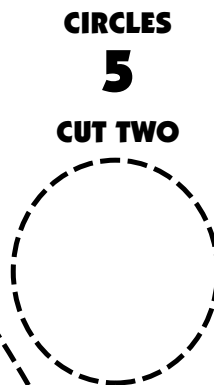
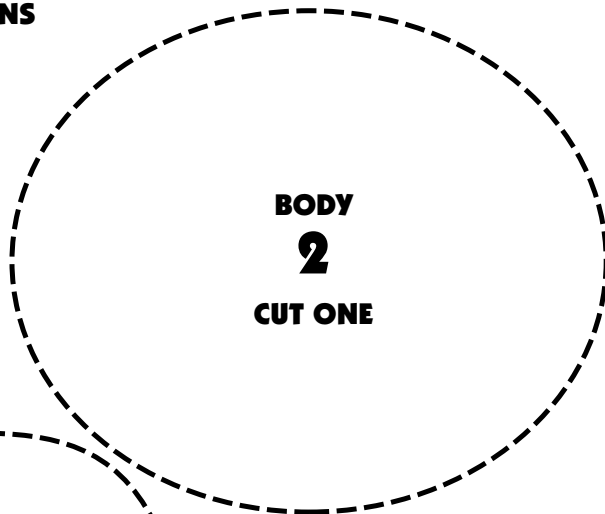


6 Cut two #8 eyes from black paper and glue on the head, or use a black marker to draw them. Use chenille pipe cleaners for antennae.

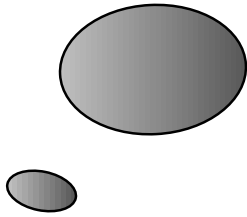
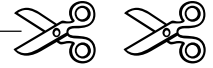
Note: If the legs are too difficult for your children to cut out, use black pipe cleaners.



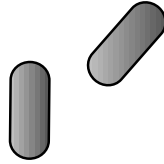
AMERICAN ROACH PATTERNS



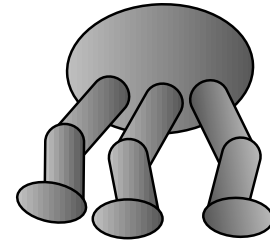
ANT



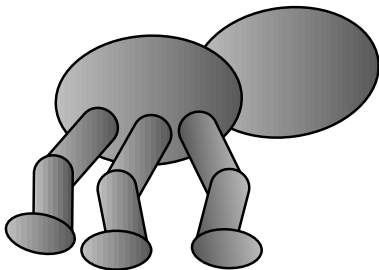
1 Cut three #1 body and head patterns from red paper. Put two aside. Cut three #2 feet from red paper.



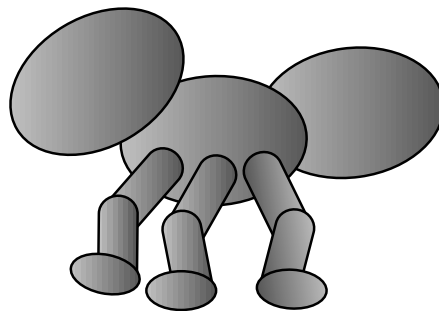
2 Cut six #3 legs from red paper. Glue two of the #3 legs together and glue one #2 to the bottom for the foot. This will form the completed leg. Make three legs.



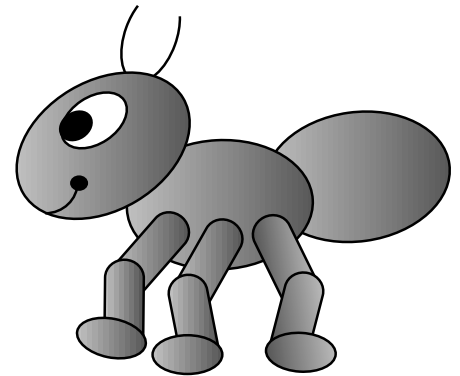
3 Glue finished legs to the body as shown. (Note: You could use brads to attach legs to the body so they are moveable.)



4 Glue one #1 pattern to the back side of the body as shown.



5 Glue the other #1 pattern to the front of the body to form the head.



6 Cut one #4 eye from white paper. Glue to the head. Cut one #5 pupil from black paper and glue to the eye. (Note: You could cut the white part of the eye and use a marker to color in the pupil.) Use chenille pipe cleaners for antennae. Draw on a mouth.

Note: Make lots of these and sing “The Ants Go Marching.” Add a craft stick to the back to make a stick puppet.
