



Setting the Stage

- Display a red-and-white checked picnic tablecloth as a background for this bulletin board idea. Students can draw ants for a border.
 They can write favorite summer activities (on paper plates) to display against the tablecloth backdrop with the caption: "Summer Can Be a Real Picnic!"
- Purchase tiny plastic black ants at a novelty store and place them on the floor leading into your classroom. You may prefer to copy ants on page 12, cut them out and tape them on the floor and on objects with clear tape.








Setting the Stage continued
