

## Understanding the Writing Process



Let's look at the writing process. Ever wonder why it's such a challenge for so many students? Dr. Mel Levine, author of *A Mind At A Time*, tells us that writing "is one of the largest orchestras a child's mind has to conduct."

It's true.

Writing requires a simultaneous integration of many critical elements. Dr. Mel Levine discusses these at length in his book, but we devised an absurd educational acronym (because let's face it, there aren't enough of those in education) called GLOFA to help you remember the components.





The G in GLOFA is all about handwriting, a **Grapho-Motor Function**. Handwriting can derail at any or more of these stations:

Pre-visualization - if the student has trouble picturing the letters in his or her mind

Motor memories - if the student has difficulty activating the correct motor sequences to make the letters

Implementation - if the student is challenged assigning the muscles for the right motor sequence

Localization - if the student has trouble tracking finger movements

It's not all gloom and doom with handwriting. Dr. Levine insists that most handwriting difficulties can be remedied with consistent and repeated letter formation drill and practice; about 15 minutes a day.


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
## Sorting and Classifying
