*(Move hand forward as if passing a ball)*

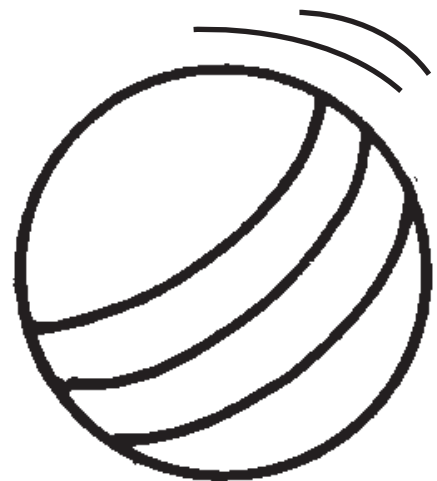
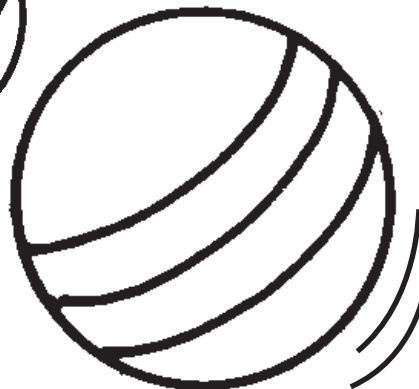
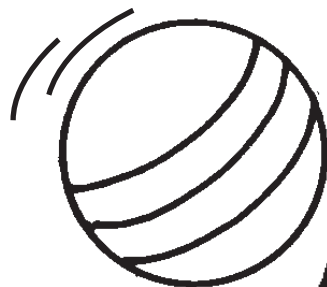
And show you a smile.

*(Curtsy, then dance in place)*

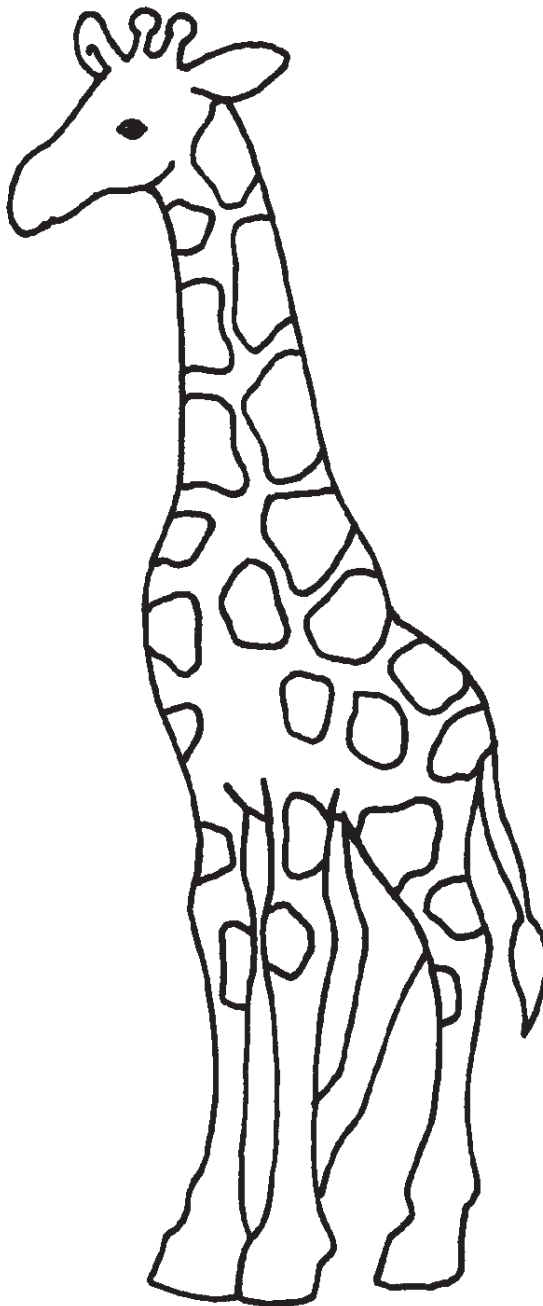
I curtsy when I sing.

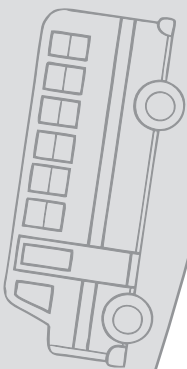
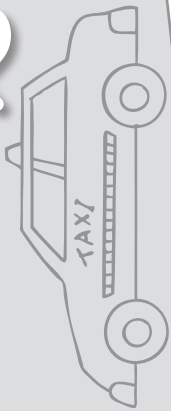
# How to Ride the Bus

Create a discussion with the children about the rules of riding the bus. What are the rules? How should we behave on the bus?

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## Transportation Rules

*(Ask children to list rules)*

*(Touch head and ask "Why?")*

If you drop crumbs, or if you spill,  
*(Open and close hands)*
