1. Interest Centre-*Fruit, Veggies, Seeds*

- models, pictures, word cards, real fruit and vegetables arranged in a basket or a bowl
- containers, seeds for matching
- poems, stories, recipes, riddles, books

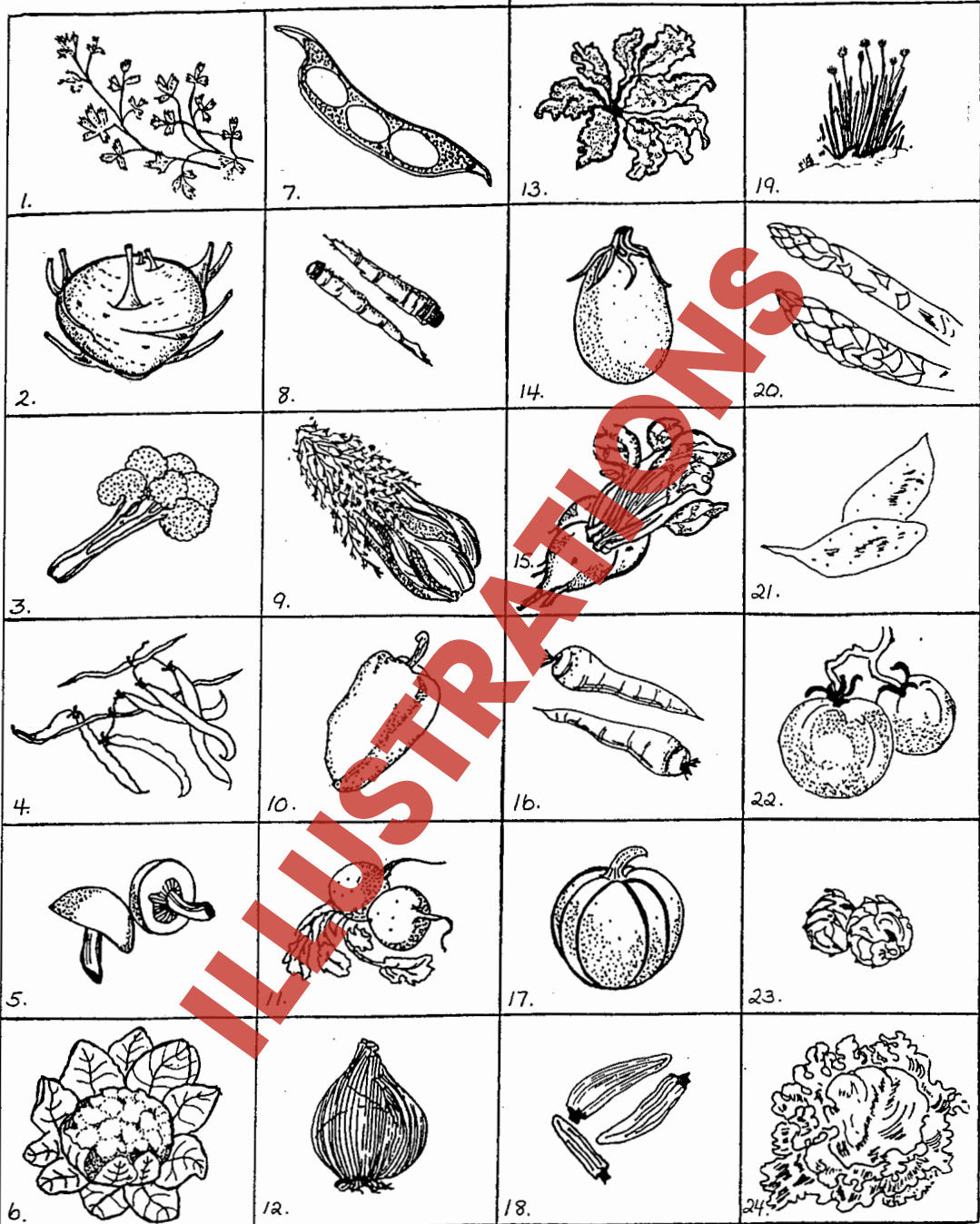
2. Writing Centre

- fruit and veggie wrapping paper to cover tins, boxes, folders, booklets

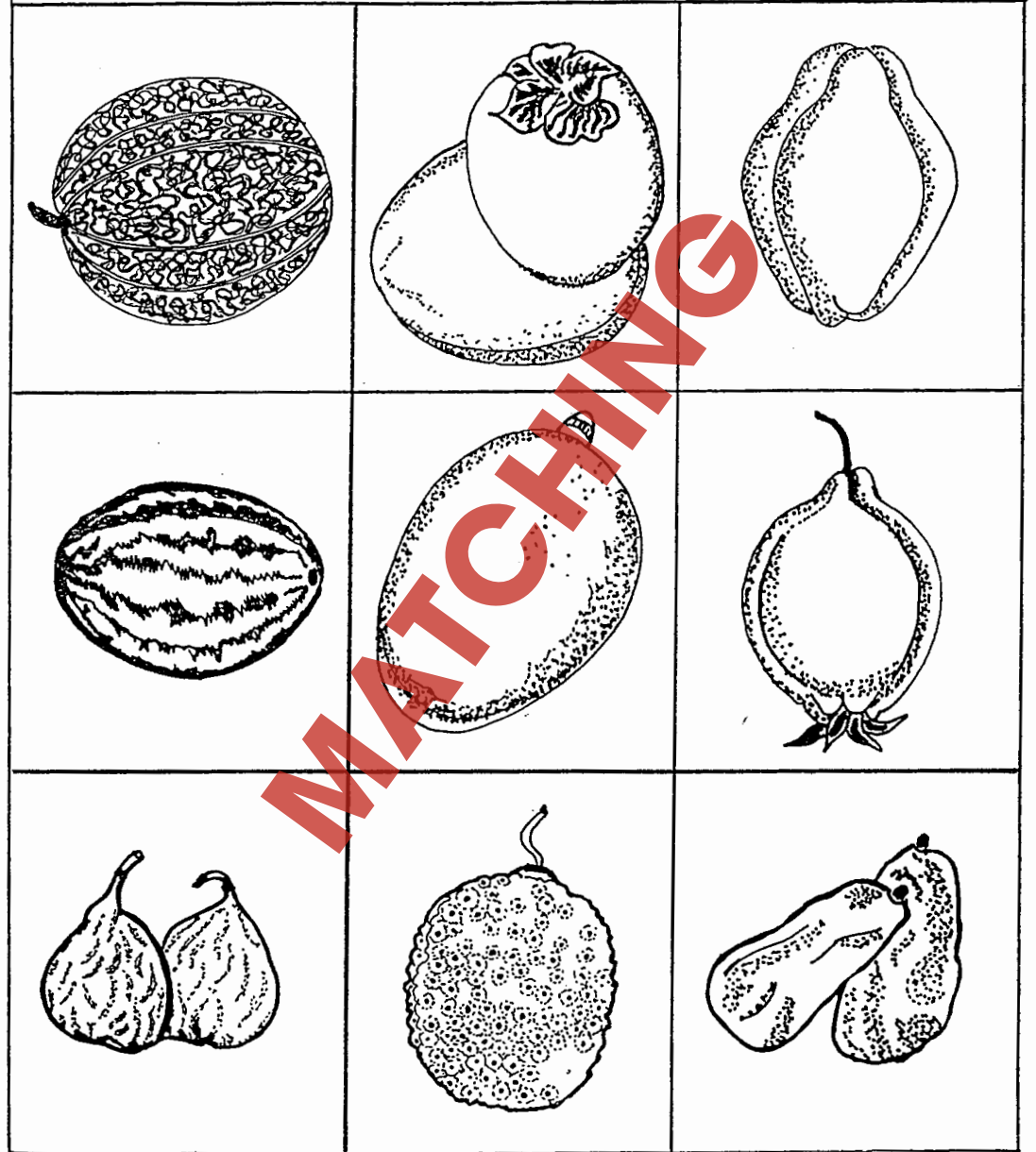
3. Word Charts / Bulletin Boards

Mount on sturdy backing and laminate. Cut out and use for a matching activity.



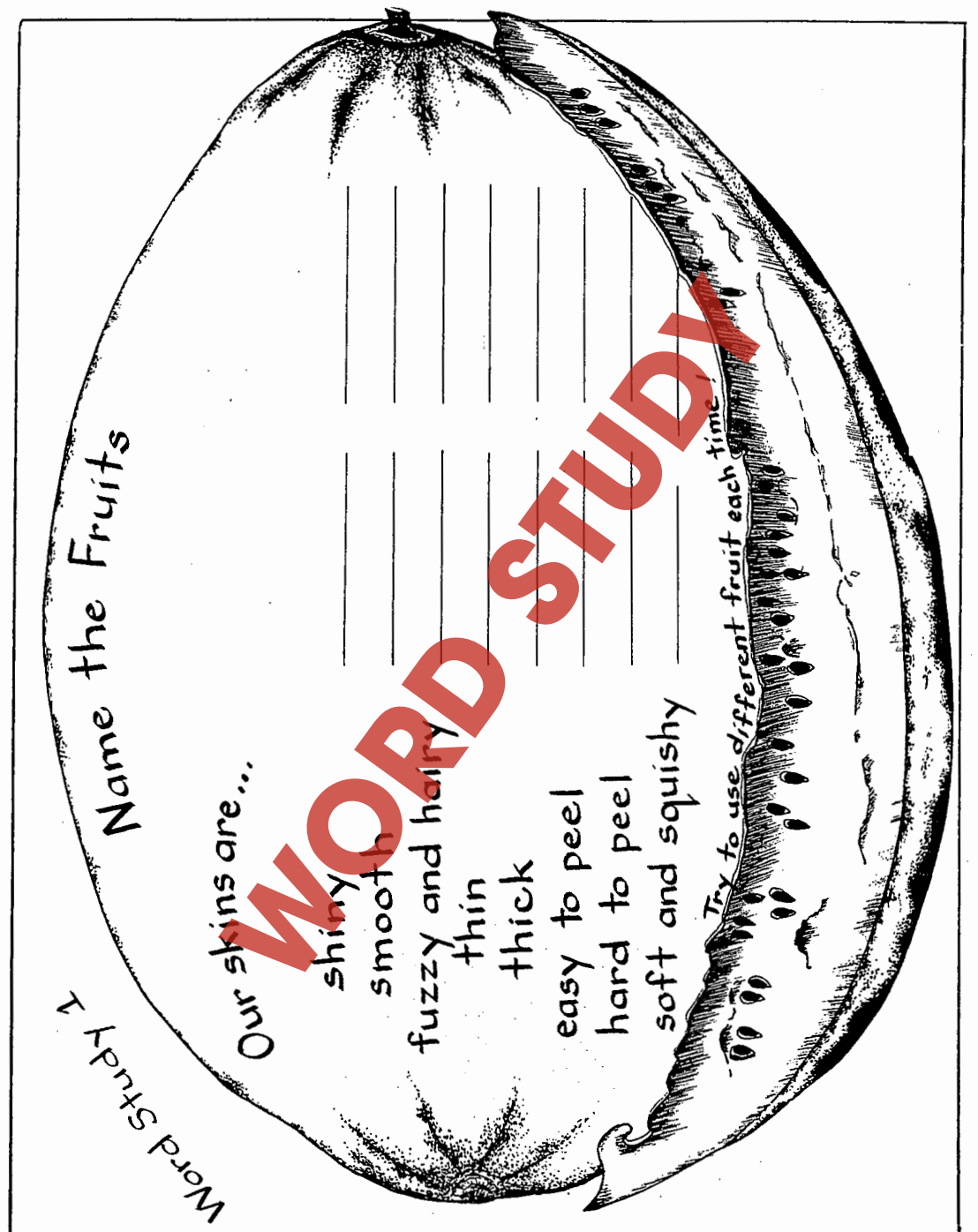

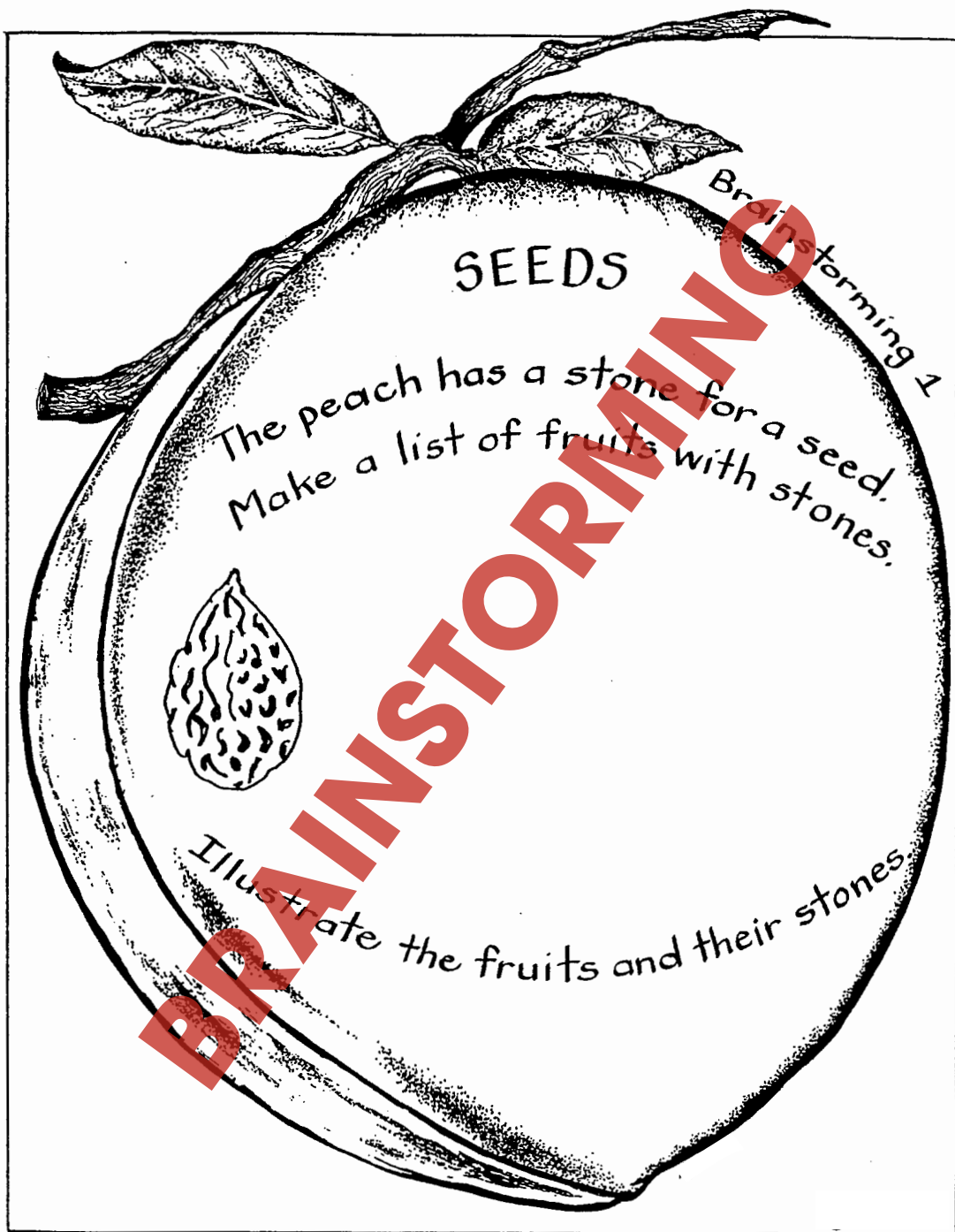

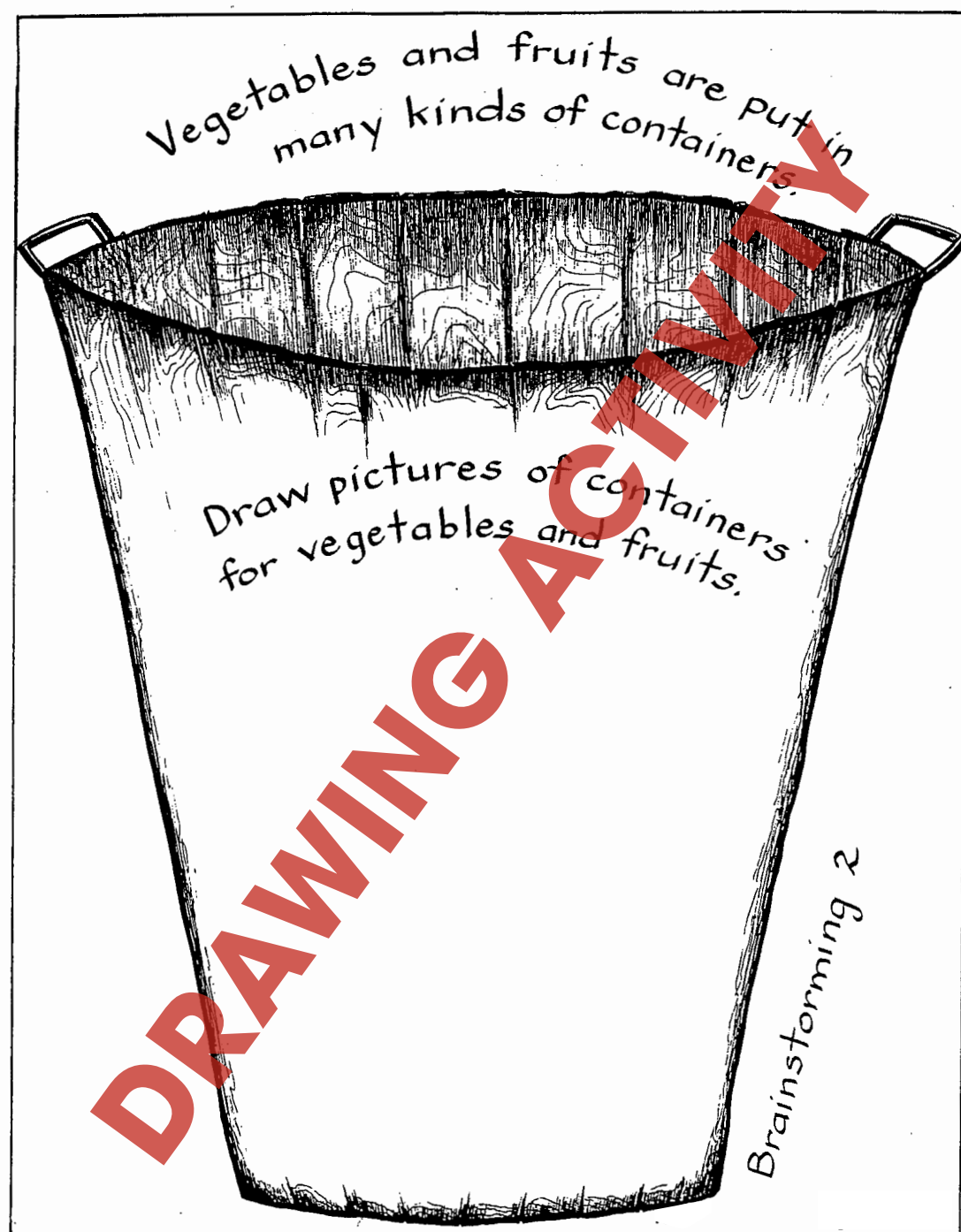


SEEDS

Illustrate the fruits and their stones.

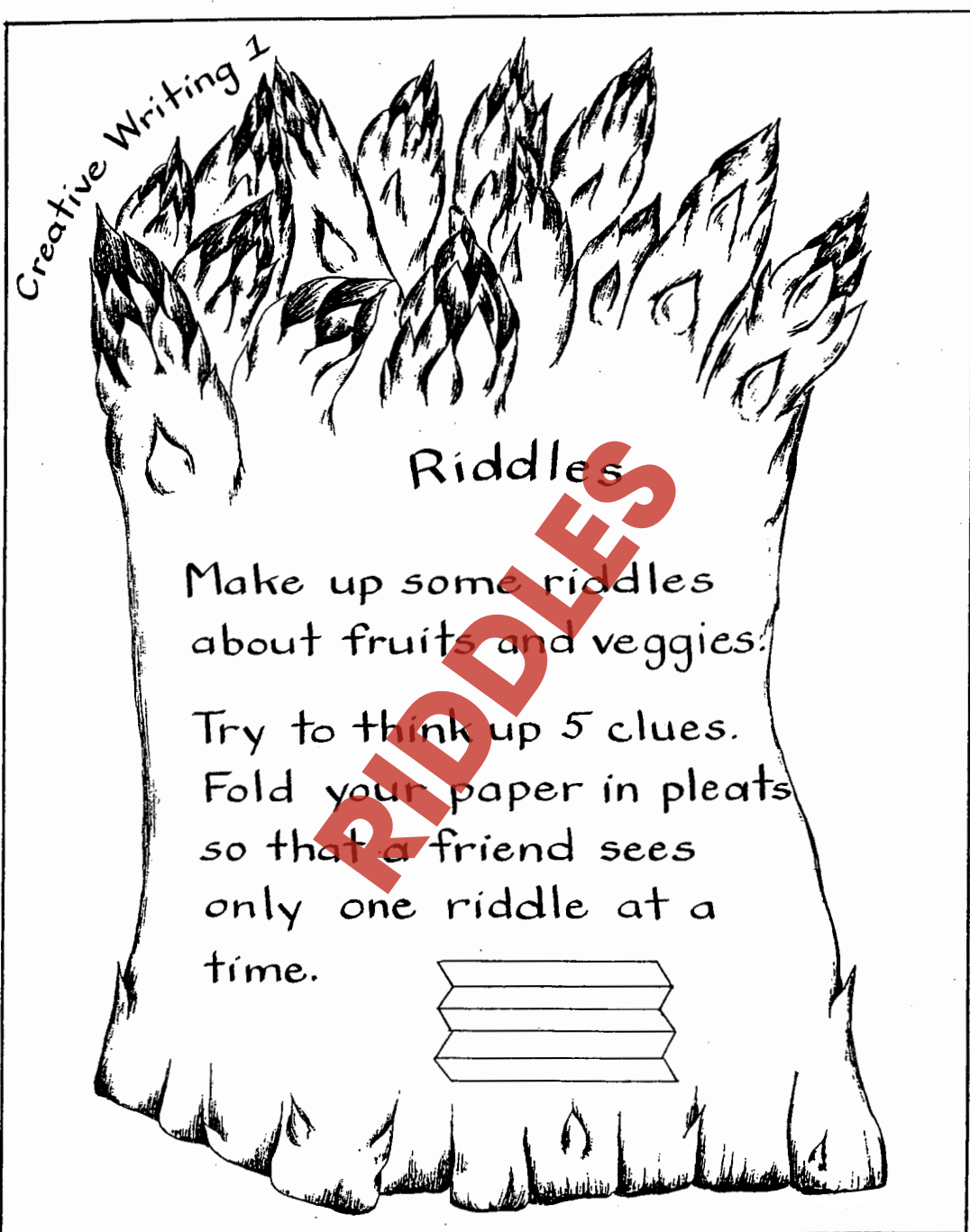
Brainstorming 1

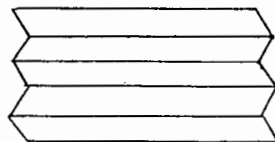


Creative Writing 1
