

## SEYMOUR'S FIRST EASTER

Suggestions for the application of the story and activities.

1. Use the story to introduce your Easter/Spring theme.

Initiate discussions-Easter preparations, feelings, eggs....  
Initiate predicting/brainstorming activities.

Choose parts of the story to dramatize e.g. situations,  
how might Mrs. \_\_\_\_\_ have said \_\_\_\_\_, character's reactions..

2. Produce a "big book" for the story.  
Students can contribute the illustrations.  
Share the book with other classes.

If the students write a sequel, they may want to produce  
a "big book" or a "mini book".

3. Give each student a copy of the story.  
Students can complete the illustrations and take their copy  
home to read.  
White out the illustrations and let the students add their own.

4. Students can practise the dialogues of the characters for  
oral reading.

Divide the story into parts for dramatization.-skits, puppet  
plays...

4. Students can retell the story and produce their own booklet.  
-accordion style, cartoon strip, filmstrip style, picture  
book...egg/basket shaped booklet...

The story may initiate a centre/theme on Grandmothers.

6. Creative Activities

Egg decorating, Easter bonnets, Easter baskets, puppets  
painting-murals, pictures, mixing paints...

7. Mathematics

Problem solving, Graphing...

"Help Seymour find his way to the Easter basket"

-Counting by 2's, 5's....

-Patterning through colours

-Math. facts 

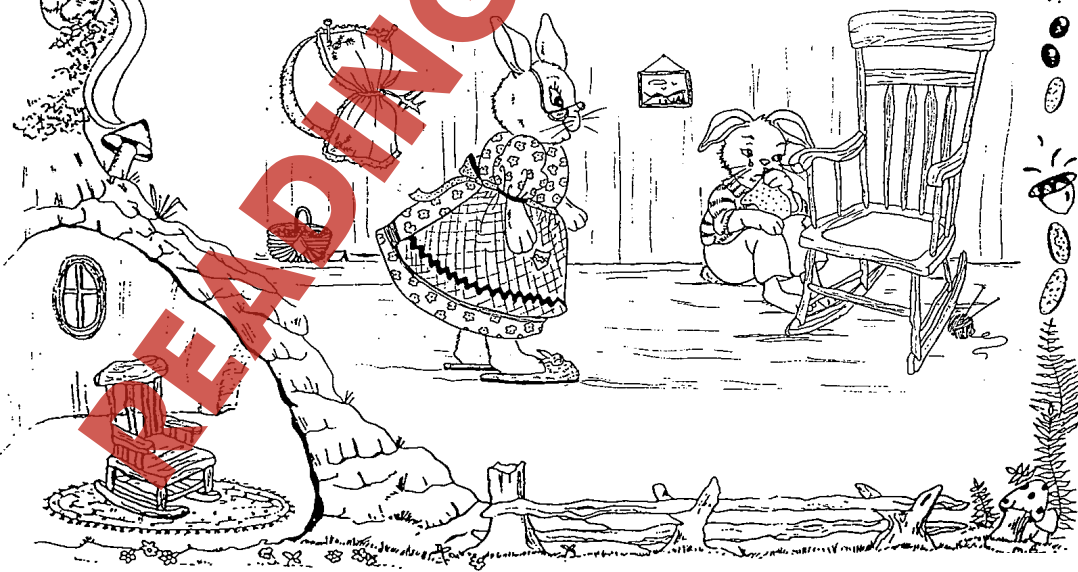
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### Seymour's First Easter

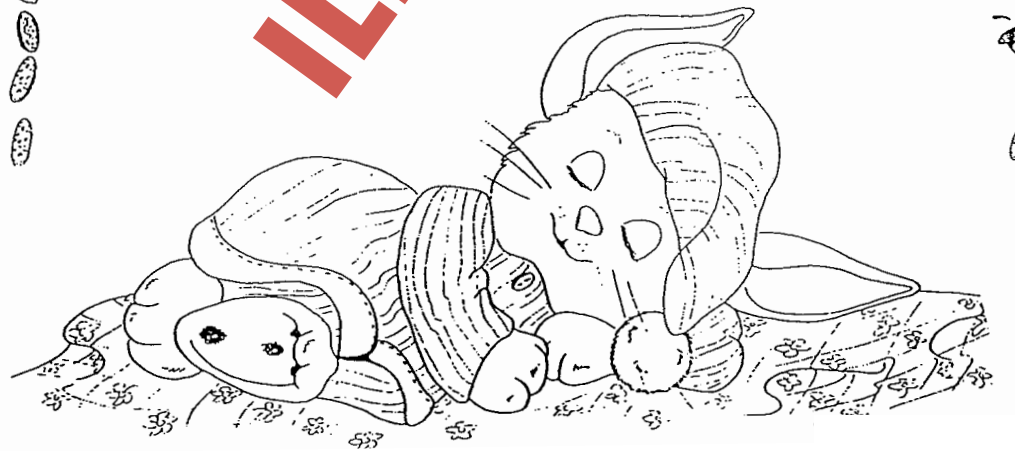
