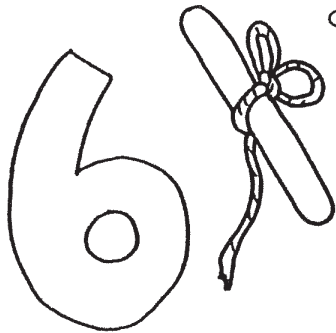


PAINTING IDEAS

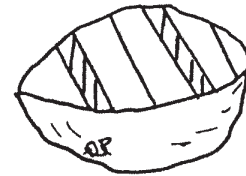
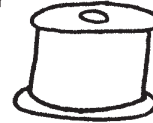
Tie yarn or string onto a popsicle stick, dip it into the paint and pull it across and around the number shape.



Paint the number shape with different colour paint and brushes, cotton swabs or by tapping paint off an old toothbrush over the number.



Pour paint onto a meat tray and dip sponges, cut potato shapes, cookie cutters, toy blocks, toy cars, forks, spools, or anything you think will give an interesting texture.



Make homemade finger paint by mixing 50 ml of liquid laundry starch and 10 ml of paint (liquid or powder).

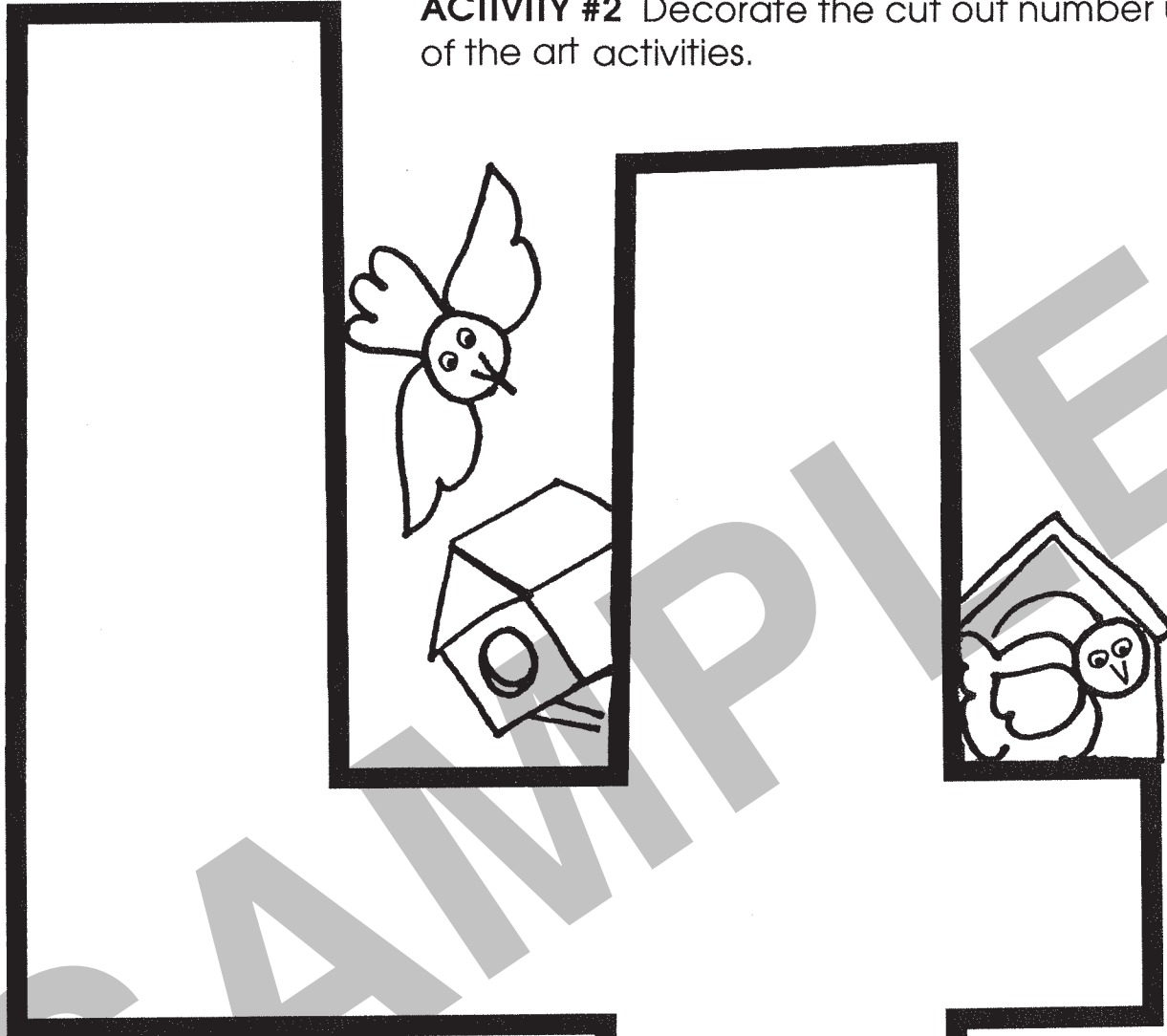


For painting with food colour, mix 50 ml of water with 3 to 4 drops of food colour and paint with cotton swabs, paintbrushes, sponges or strings.

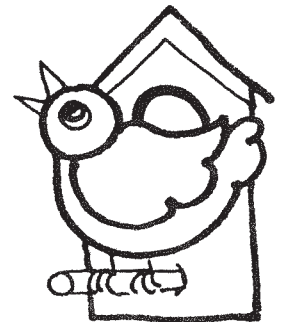


ACTIVITY #1 Point to the number and name it. Count the objects on this page and let your child colour the page.

ACTIVITY #2 Decorate the cut out number using one of the art activities.

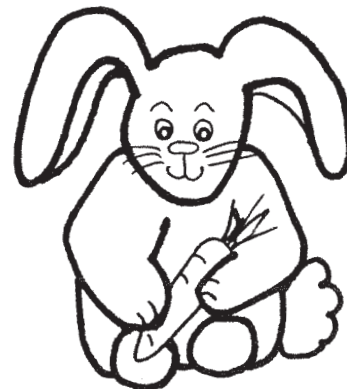
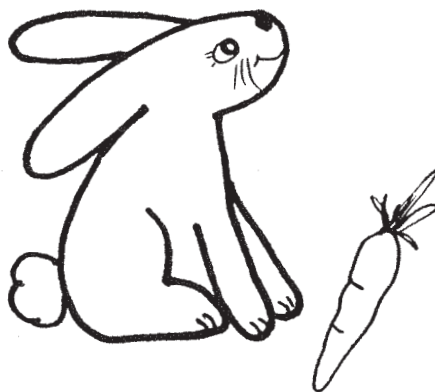
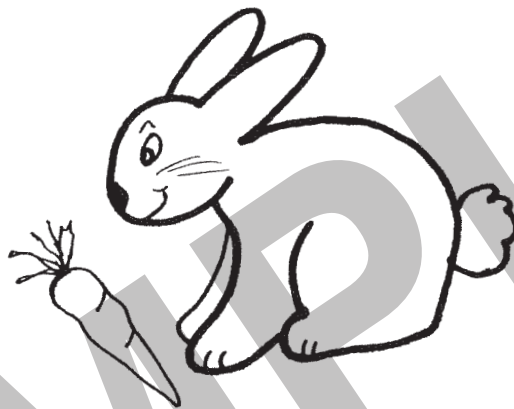
