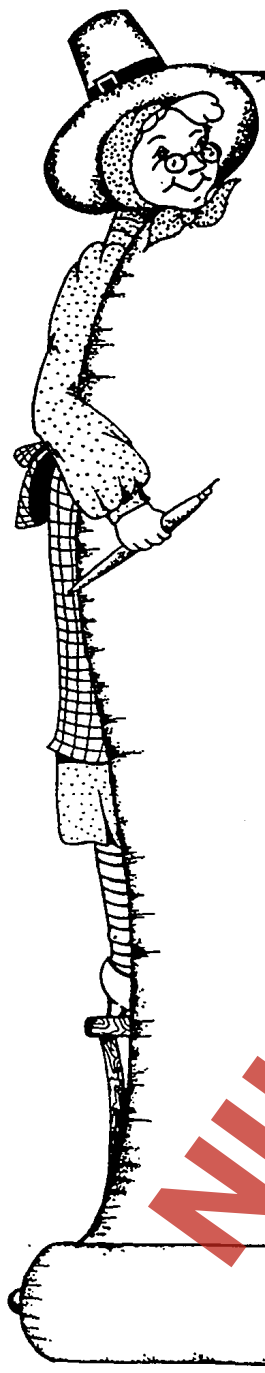

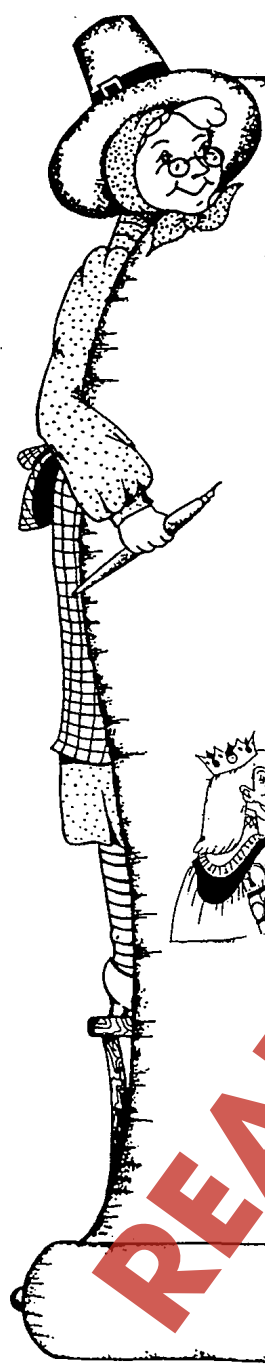
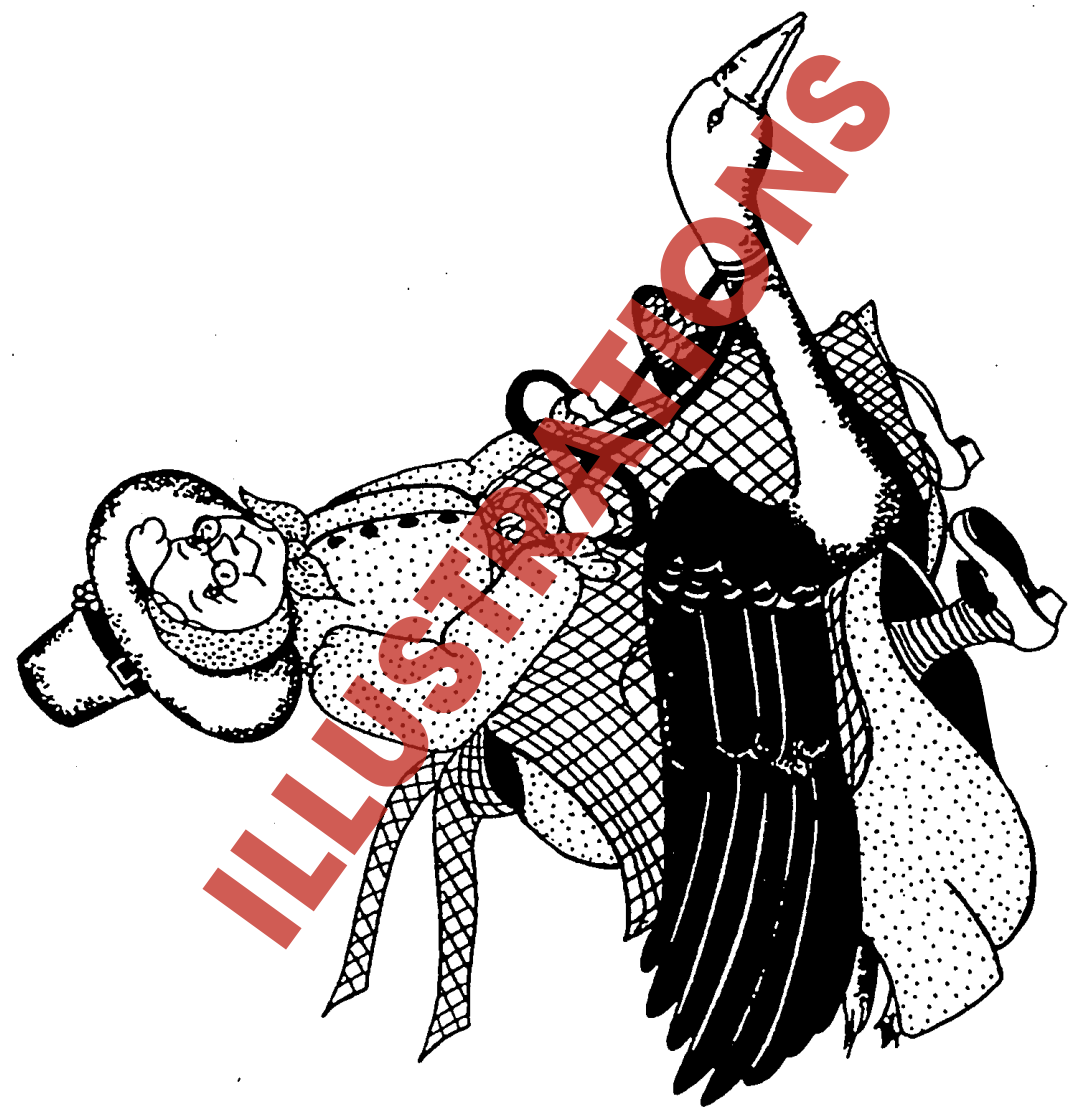
Mother Goose

Nor not very bad.



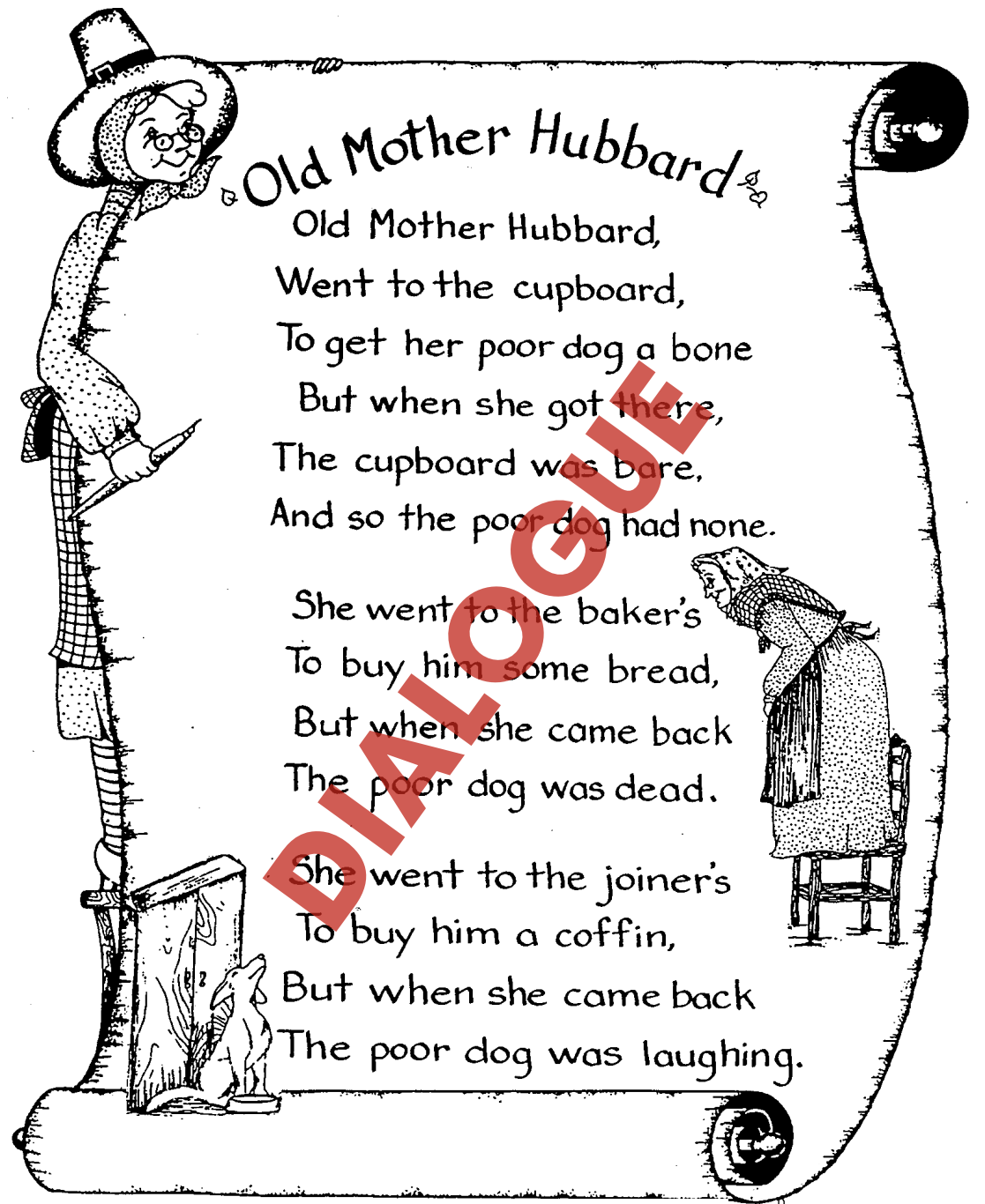
The Queen of Hearts

And vowed he'd steal no more.



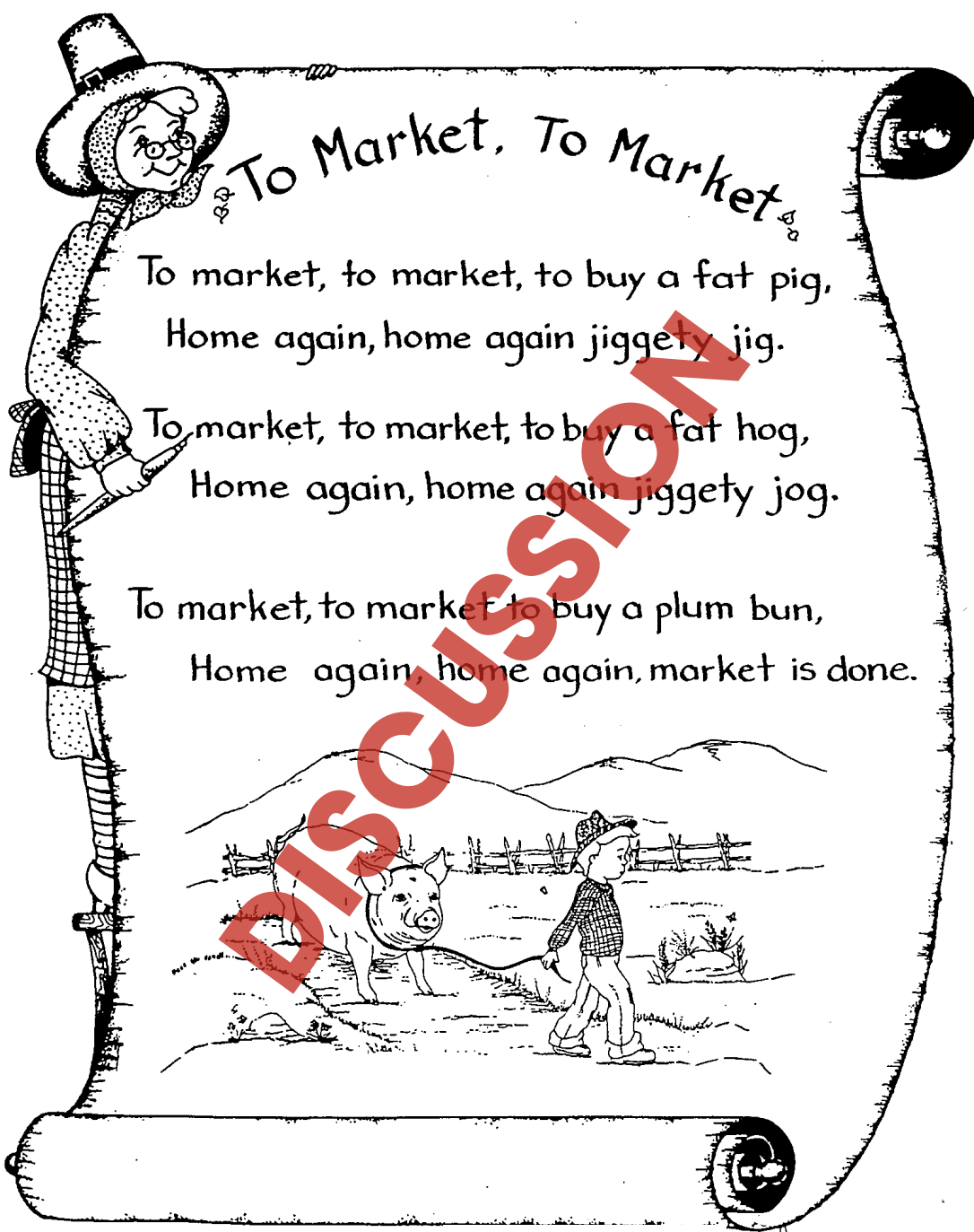


Old Mother Hubbard

The poor dog was laughing.

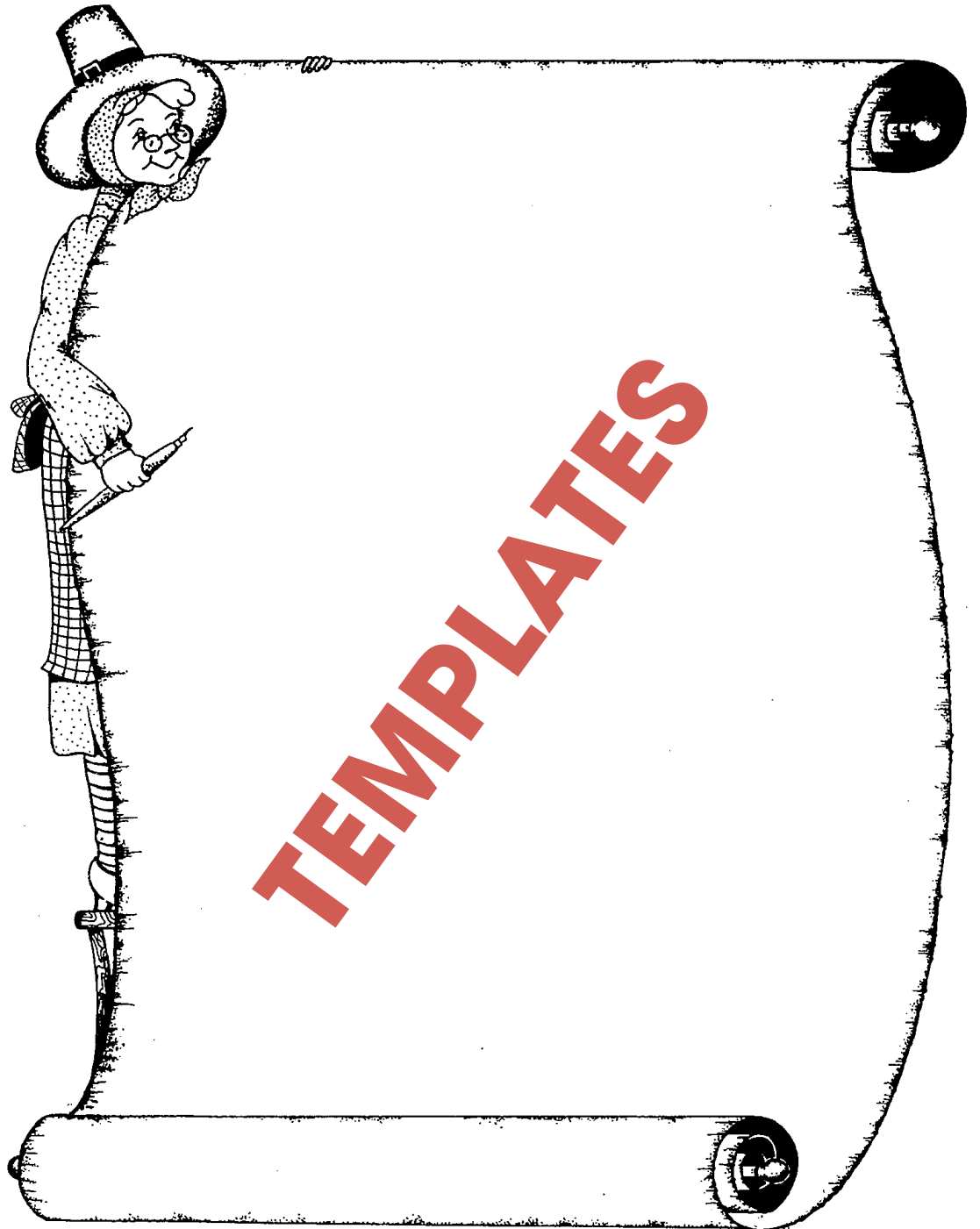


To Market, To Market
