TALK ABOUT IT

What do we notice?

- five letters
- digraph *th* at the beginning
- contains the words *an* and *than*

Special Feature: rime *-ank*

LOOK FOR PATTERNS

Find on the word wall

- words with *th*: **the than**

BUILD IT

Build these words, adding one letter at a time until you build *thank*:

a an tan than thank

Use the rime *-ank* to build these words:

thank tank sank yank bank blank

Add endings to these *-ank* words:

thank thanks thanked thanking

bank banks banked banking banker

yank yanks yanked yanking

WRITE IT

Add the word *thank* to your word books.

USE IT

Write thank-you notes.

TALK ABOUT IT

What do we notice?

- both have three letters
- both have three sounds
- vowel sound is short *a*
- CVC words
- contain the words *ad* and *as*

Special Feature: rime *-ad*

LOOK FOR PATTERNS

Find on the word wall

- words with the sound /ă/:
- | | | | |
|-------------|--------------|--------------|------------|
| an | and | at | am |
| as | can | man | ran |
| than | black | thank | |

BUILD IT

Change the beginning letter to build these words in the *-ad* rime family:

had bad dad fad lad mad pad sad

Change the final letter to build these words:

had has ham hat

Add a letter to *had* and *has* to build more words:

had hand

has hash

Change the vowel to make these words:

had hid hood

has his

WRITE IT

Add the words *has* and *had* to your word books.

think drink

TALK ABOUT IT

What do we notice?

- both end in *ink*
- digraph *th* in *think*
- contain the words *in, ink, thin, rink*

Special Features: blend *dr*, final blend *nk*, rime *-ink*

LOOK FOR PATTERNS

Find on the word wall

- one letter different from *think*: **thank**
- *r*-blend words: **brown from green three bring try**

BUILD IT

Build *think* and *drink* from *in*, adding one letter at a time.

in tin thin think

in ink rink drink

Build these words with the rime *-ink*:

think pink wink rink drink

link blink sink stink

WRITE IT

Add the words *think* and *drink* to your word books.

USE IT

Use words in the *-ink* word family to make a silly sentence. For example:

I think that pink drink in the sink stinks!
