This Is Me!

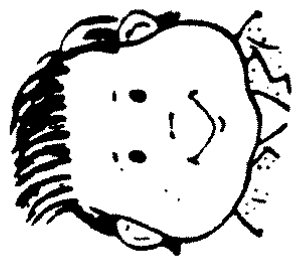
Student Objective: to build a model of his or herself using the given face and hair components.

You'll need a lettersize file, crayons, glue, scissors.

1. Color the face with fleshstone.
2. Mount the face inside the file, right hand side works best. Left side print-This Is Me.
3. Use the label on the bottom of page for the outside of the file.
4. Photocopy enough hairstyles eyes etc and color to give several choices of color and styles. Cut out pieces and laminate.
5. Use an envelope or zip bag to keep the pieces inside the file.

Another Idea:

Use as a pastep activity for the children to make themselves or a friend.

I would like you to meet Great Big-Wonderful Me!

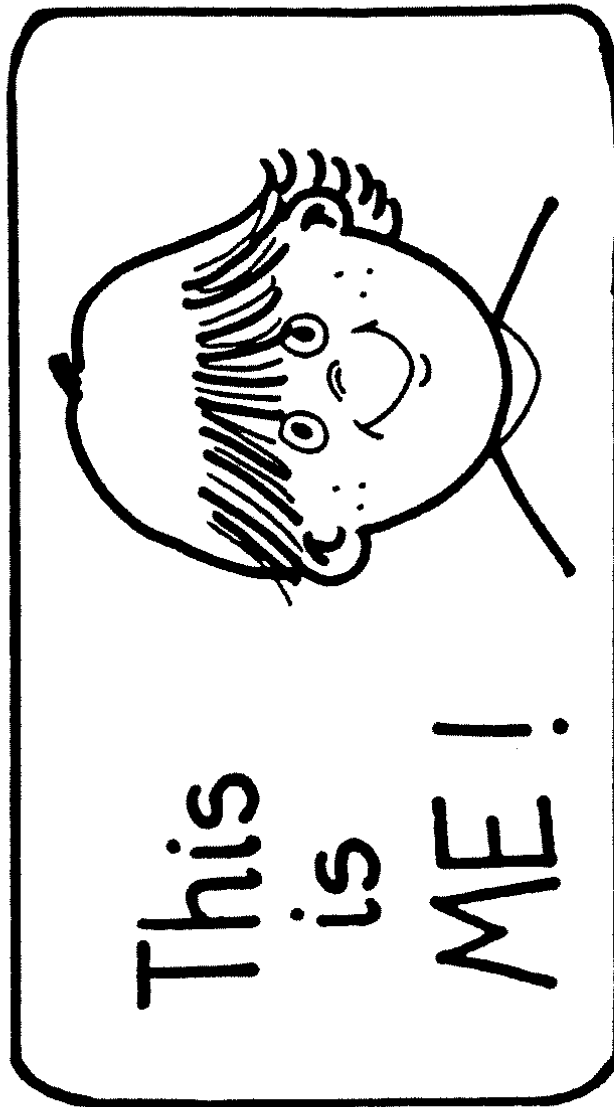
This teacher resource package is based on the "all about me" theme.

Read the rebus stories to the class before they complete the activities. Some teachers use these with a Share Partner.

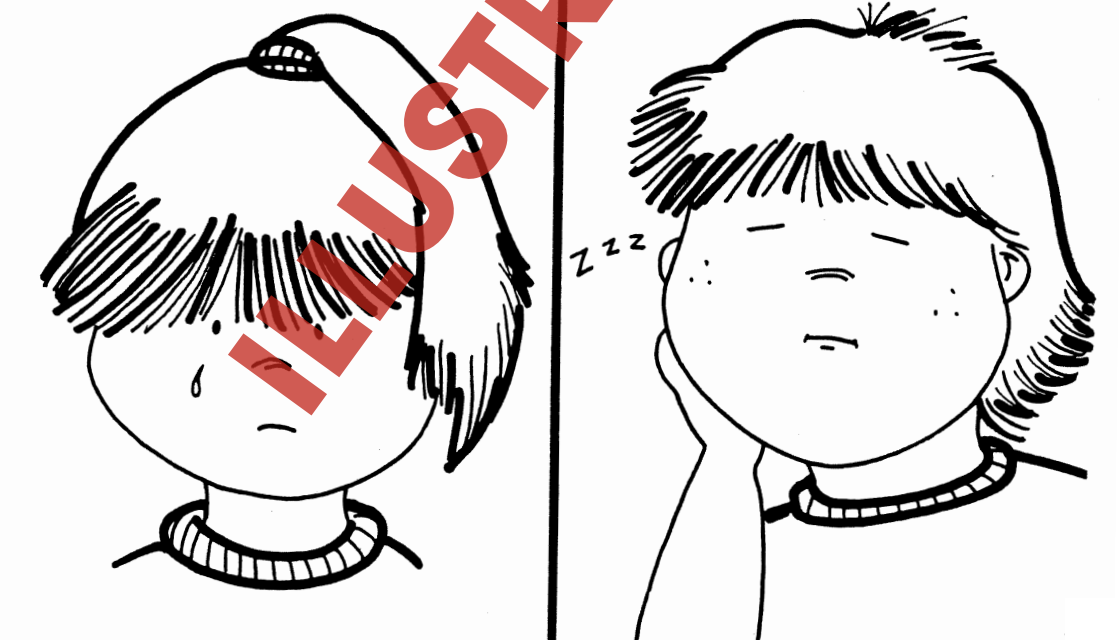
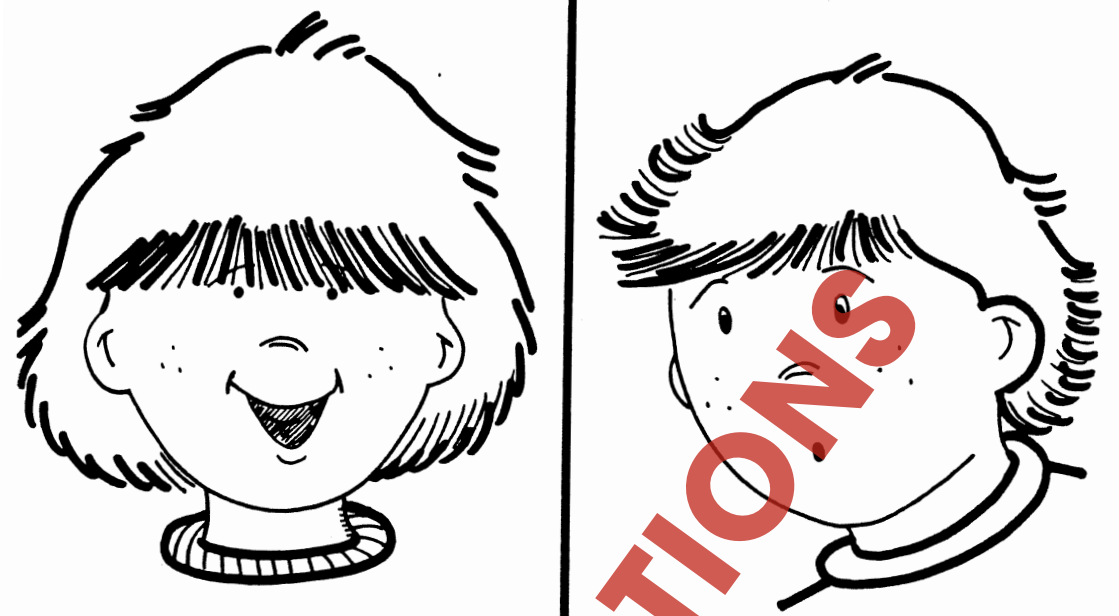

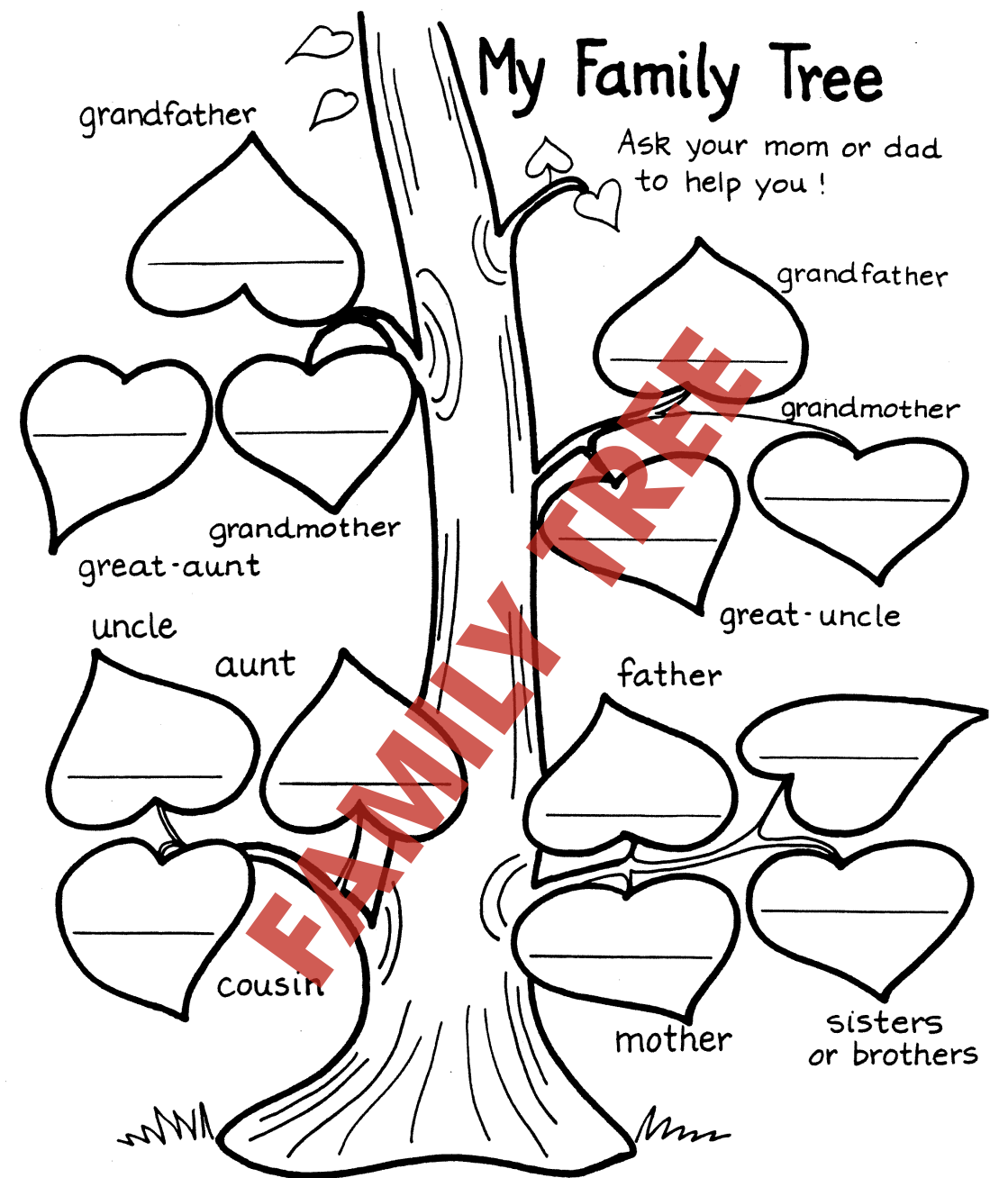
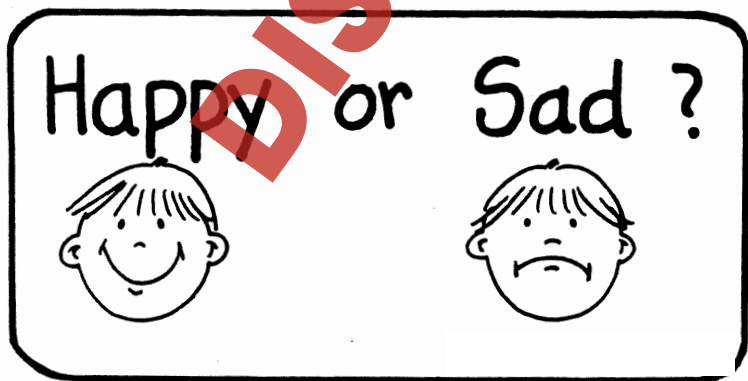


Happy or Sad?

Student Objective: to discover what makes one happy and sad.

You'll need a lettersize file, crayons, glue, scissors.

1. Color and cut out the 2 large illustrative pictures. Glue inside the file - one on either side.
2. Color and cut out smaller pictures. Laminate. (Mount on bristol if you like)
* You could also duplicate onto manilla tag and color.
3. Keep pictures inside file for sorting.
4. Color and cut out label picture and glue onto outside of file.
5. Include the 2 worksheets for an additional creative activity.

Sort Out the House!

Student Objective: to classify the household items according to room.

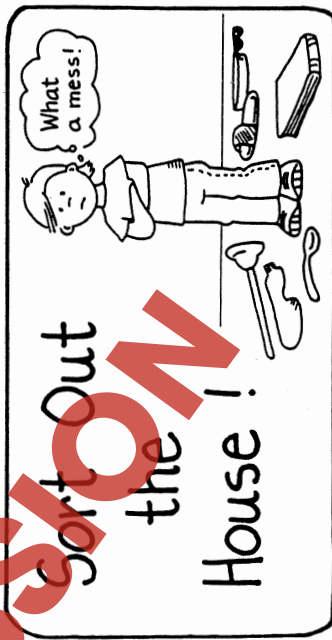
You'll need a letter-size file, crayons, glue, scissors.

1. Color and cut out the house. Mount on the inside of the file, matching the 2 pages at the fold of the file. Glue label outside.
2. Color and cut out the household items.

* You could also photocopy these pieces onto manilla tag. Color and cut out.

3. Laminiate the folder and the pieces.

Store the pieces in an envelope or zip-close bag.



THE FUTURE

When I Grow Up

Student Objective: to discuss career choices and to draw an illustration.

You'll need 6 sheets of bristol, approx 9x12", crayons, glue, scissors.

1. Color and mount the 6 illustrative pictures.
2. Photocopy the drawing page for the class.

How to Use:

1. Display and read the pages. Discuss the questions, with the class, at the bottom of each page.
2. Distribute drawing pages.

Another Idea: you may want to make a booklet of all the illustrations for each child in the class.
