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Introduction

The purpose of phonics is to help students read new words by sounding them out. The student who uses phonics to decode a word can associate the printed letters with the speech sounds the letters represent and then blend them together to pronounce the word.


In most phonics programs, the initial consonant sounds are presented first, and the medial and final sounds are taught later. This book, *Final & Medial Consonants*, follows and provides additional practice in the use of consonants, focusing on consonant sounds at the end and in the middle of a word.


The first part of the book provides practice for consonants at the end of words. Most letters are covered by lessons of four sections. In the first section, students look at pictures, name them, and circle those pictures ending in a particular sound. In the second and third sections, students are given rhyming words or picture clues for practice in writing words that end with the same sound. And in the final exercise for each sound, students use the words in sentences or riddles, or they match the words to their meanings.


The second half of *Final & Medial Consonants* deals with the consonant sounds in the medial position of words. The sounds are introduced through picture clues and word completion exercises that stress the medial position of the consonant.


The review pages, which occur throughout the book, provide practice in discriminating the sounds of four or more consonants. A general review is found at the end of the book. Some consonants are rarely found in the medial and final positions; this book focuses on the consonants that are commonly found in those positions. It does not cover *c*, *h*, *j*, *q*, *w*, or *y*.


Final & Medial Consonants, as well as the other books in this series, is meant for use at home or in school. At home, the books may be used as a supplement to schoolwork. In school, the teacher may use them as a phonics text in the primary grades or as a supplementary aid for students who need extra help in phonics. Teachers at the junior high or high school levels will also find these books to be an effective tool for remediation in the elements of phonics.


