#### To the Teacher

Developing Reading Power is a unique supplemental series in which high-interest stories are brought together with activities that promote literal and inferential comprehension.

Books 1 and 2 of the series have been developed to begin teaching reading comprehension with the types of activities found in all of the *Developing Reading Power* books. Stories in the four-book series were chosen for high-interest appeal and, where appropriate, readability was measured in Degress of Reading Power (DRP)\* units.

It is recommended that the directions for the activities be read to the students throughout Book 1. Keep in mind that the purpose of the activities in Book 1 is readiness for the remainder of the *Developing Reading*  Power series, and the constant interaction between teacher and students while the activities are being completed will alert the teacher to special problems some students may be having.

Book 1 prepares young students for the development of basic reading skills. A variety of activities are used throughout the lessons. Emphasis is placed on comprehension skills, and the cloze technique is introduced in a simplified form.

Book 1 presents a progression of skills that work best when the lessons are completed in sequential order. These skills are necessary in the development of readiness comprehension. The comprehension skills covered in Book 1 are listed below.




## Fun with the Airplane


