He eventually returned to Toronto, got married and started a family. He worked in restaurants in the evenings and looked after his children during the day. It was during this time that his career as a writer began to flourish, starting with the publishing of some short stories in the *The Globe and Mail* newspaper. Scrimger's most acclaimed book is *The Nos* from Jupiter, a book which has spawned a successful series of novels. In addition to his children's books, Scrimger has also written novels for adults, including Crosstown, Still Life With Children and Mystical Rose.



Scrimger now lives in Cobourg, Ontario and teaches at Humber College School for Writers in Toronto.


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


