The History of the Olympics

UNIT OVERVIEW

The "Let's Go to the Olympics" unit looks at general information about the Olympic Games. Students study the information about the Olympic Games as they read the newspaper articles and charts that are included in this unit. Students practice using different reading, writing, research, and language arts skills as they complete the activities in the "Let's Go to the Olympics" unit. This unit is divided into three sections. Section One includes a series of lessons designed to provide students with interesting facts and information about the Olympic Games. Section Two includes a number of optional lessons that teachers can use to supplement the main lessons of the unit. Section Three provides a suggestion for a major project that the students can complete during the unit or when they have finished the main lessons of the unit. A book display should be set up somewhere in the classroom. A wide variety of books on the Olympic Games and the different sporting events should be included in the display. Students refer to the books during the course of the unit.

<u>SECTION I – LESSONS</u>

Section I contains ten structured lessons dealing with general aspects of the Olympic Games. Students read a series of newspaper articles, research different sources, and use a number of different charts to complete the activities of these lessons.

OLYMPICS REVIVED IN 1896

1500 years after the final Ancient Olympic Games, the first modern Olympic Games were held. Baron Pierre de Coubertin of France w the man responsible for reviving the Olympic Games. He loved amateur sports and wanted every athlete in every country to have the opportunity to compete in the Olympic Games. He wanted the Olympics to be fair to all athletes. Baron Pierre de Coubertin also liked the idea of the Olympic Games promoting peace among all the countries of the world.

FIRST MODERN OLYMPIC GAMES **HELD IN ATHENS, GREECE**

The first modern Olympic Games were declared open on the afternoon

of April 6, 1896. They were declared open by King George Land took place in Athens, Greece. There were 245 athletes who took part in the Olympic Games. The athletes were all men and were from 14 different countries. Most of the athletes were from Greece, Germany, and France. The Olympic Games involved 9 different events. The events included: athletics, cycling, fencing, gymnastics, shooting, swimming, tennis, weightlifting, and wrestling. Winners of each event received an olive branch, a certificate, and a silver medal. Second place finishers in each event received a laurel sprig and a copper medal.

GEORGIOS AVERNOFF DONATES ONE MILLION DRACHMA TO **OLYMPIC GAMES REVIVAL**

Georgios Avernoff was a wealthy Greek businessman. He donated one million drachma to the first modern Olympic Games. The Greek Organizing Committee used his donation to help reconstruct the Pananthenaic Stadium in Athens. The stadium was originally built in 330 BC. In addition to receiving donations, the Greek Organizing Committee sold souvenirs and postage stamps to raise money for the first modern Olympic Games.


