CARTOONS AND COMICS

UNIT OVERVIEW

This cartooning unit is designed specifically for teachers (and students) with little or no talent when it comes to drawing. The lessons follow a progression from simpler less original activities to more difficult and more creative assignments. As well, teachers can choose from a number of optional activities that have been included to add flexibility to the unit.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

1. Making Faces - Students redraw six common facial expressions in this introductory lesson.

2. Cartoon Cops Sketch Artist - Students read eyewitness descriptions of four robbery suspects and make sketches for the cartoon police.

3. Cartoon Lettering - Students print their first name using various styles of lettering.

4. Share Something Good - Students draw a large-sized cartoon character and communicate a positive message using a poster format.


5. Original Cartoon Family - Students create an original cartoon family of their own centred around a common theme.

6. The World's Oldest Jokes - Students create two original comic strip characters who tell one of the oldest jokes in the world.


MAC THE KNIFE





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
