
The holidays celebrated in North America serve as a rich source of literature and oral tradition. The unit contains ten lessons, each featuring a play about one of our holidays.


Imagine another way the animals might have saved Tom Turkey. Write a story describing this plan and the results of it. Your story should be at least a half page in length.
