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### **Unit Overview**

The Robert Munsch author study unit can be used in the Language Arts area to strengthen children's reading and writing skills. Throughout this unit, children are involved in many different activities that focus their attention on language and how it is used. Children brainstorm, study how words are put together, read Robert Munsch books, answer questions in complete sentences and complete writing activities.

A display of Robert Munsch books set up in the classroom motivates children and encourages them to read for enjoyment, Robert Munsch has written many books and only ten are used in this unit. The children read other Robert Munsch books in their spare time and during silent reading.

### <u>Spelling</u>

The spelling lessons follow a set sequence of five activities a follows:

### <u>Day One</u>

The children print each of their spelling words three to five times in their spelling notebooks.

### Day Two

The children print a complete sentence for each of their spelling words in their spelling notebooks.

### **Day Three**

The children work with a partner to practice their spelling words. They use individual white boards or slates to practice their spelling words.

### Day Four

Test the children on their spelling words. Those children who get 100% on the test do not need to rewrite the spelling test on day five.

### <u>Day Five</u>

Retest the children who did not get 100 % on their spelling test on day four.

There are three different spelling lists for each of the two weeks in the Robert Munsch unit. One list may be chosen for the entire class or the children can be divided into three different spelling groups and given appropriate word lists.

### <u>Brainstorming</u>

Each day, the children brainstorm words that are related to the Robert Munsch book being read that day.

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
