Prepare the backs of the pieces for a storyboard.

- For a flannel board: place dots of self adhesive velcro or flannel.
- For a magnet board, place magnetic strips on the backs.
- For a cardboard or magnetic display board or a blackboard, us sticky tack as needed.

▼ The story text

Trim the pages of the story text. Use a chisel tip marker to outline the page with some colour. Number the pages. Mount the story text onto $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" bristle pages or cardstock. Laminate.

▼ Story folders

Make a story folder to hold the text and story pictures.

Label a presentation folder. Write the title of the story on a label placed on the outside of the folder. Store the story picture pieces in a zip close bag, placed in one of the pockets.





How to use

Become familiar with the story before telling it to the class. This is an oral story and the text is provided for a reference. You can tell the story your way. Add the story pictures to the storyboard when the text is bolded. Follow any instructions included in the text.

Provide the story folder for students to retell the story.

Read the story. Instructions for adding story pictures to the storyboard are given.


Follow up discussion

Reinforce counting skills. Ask how many chickadees are in the birdbath? How many chickadees are on a tree branch? How many chickadees are building a nest? Did you know that chickadees like to be in pairs?

Reinforce subtraction and addition skills by moving the story pieces around the storyboard for example: Let's fly a chickadee from the birdbath to the branch. How many chickadees are on the branch now?


