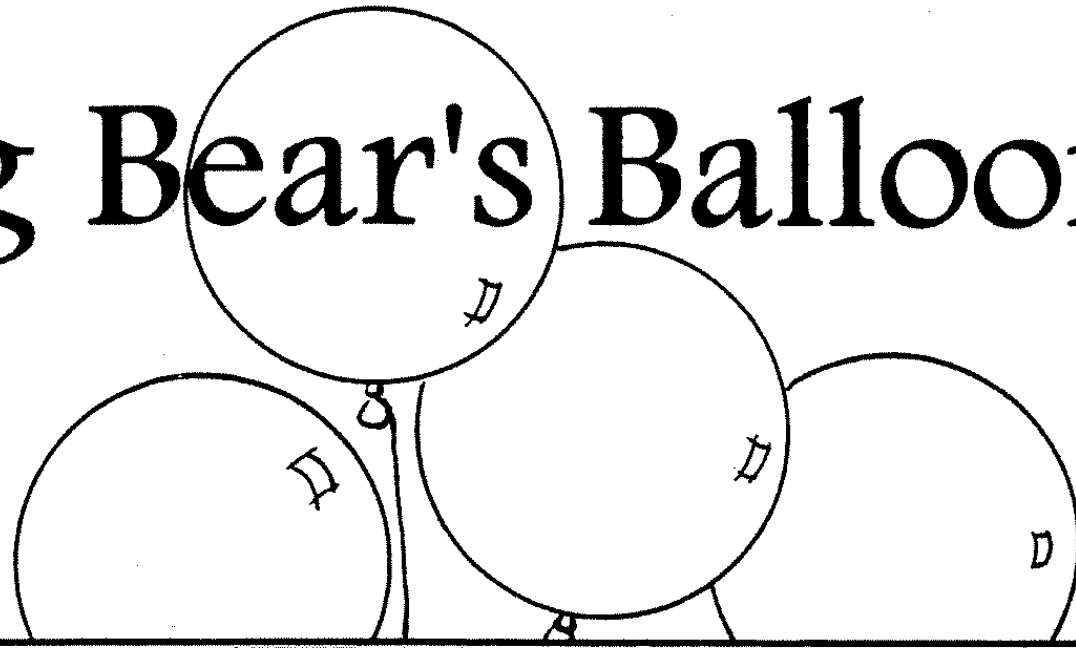


Bing Bear's Balloons

How to Assemble Bing Bear's Balloons Big Book

You will need two sheets of colourful 2-ply bristol cut into four equal pieces to give you 8 pages.

Make a photocopy of the text pages and the illustrations. Colour the pictures. Outline the text pages with a chisel tip marker. You can outline each page in the new colour mentioned on that page.

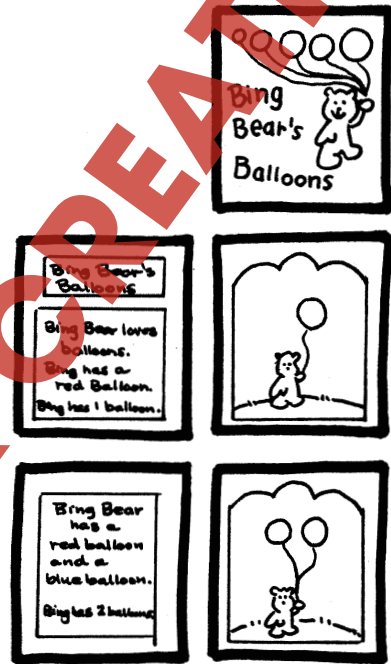
Set up as shown:

1. Glue on the cover.

2. Glue in the title page on the inside cover. Glue in page one.

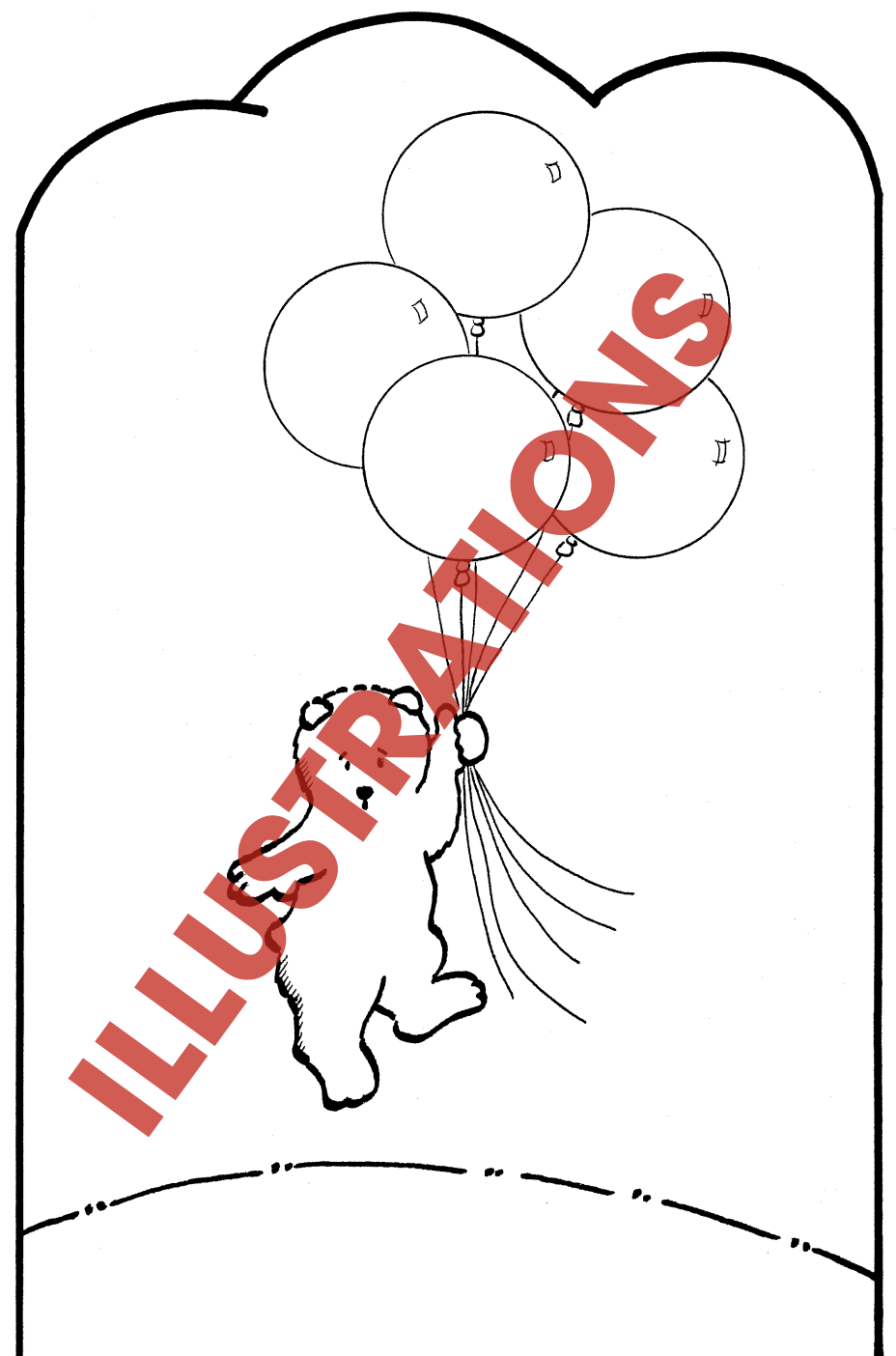
3. Glue in the illustration and text for pages two and three.....

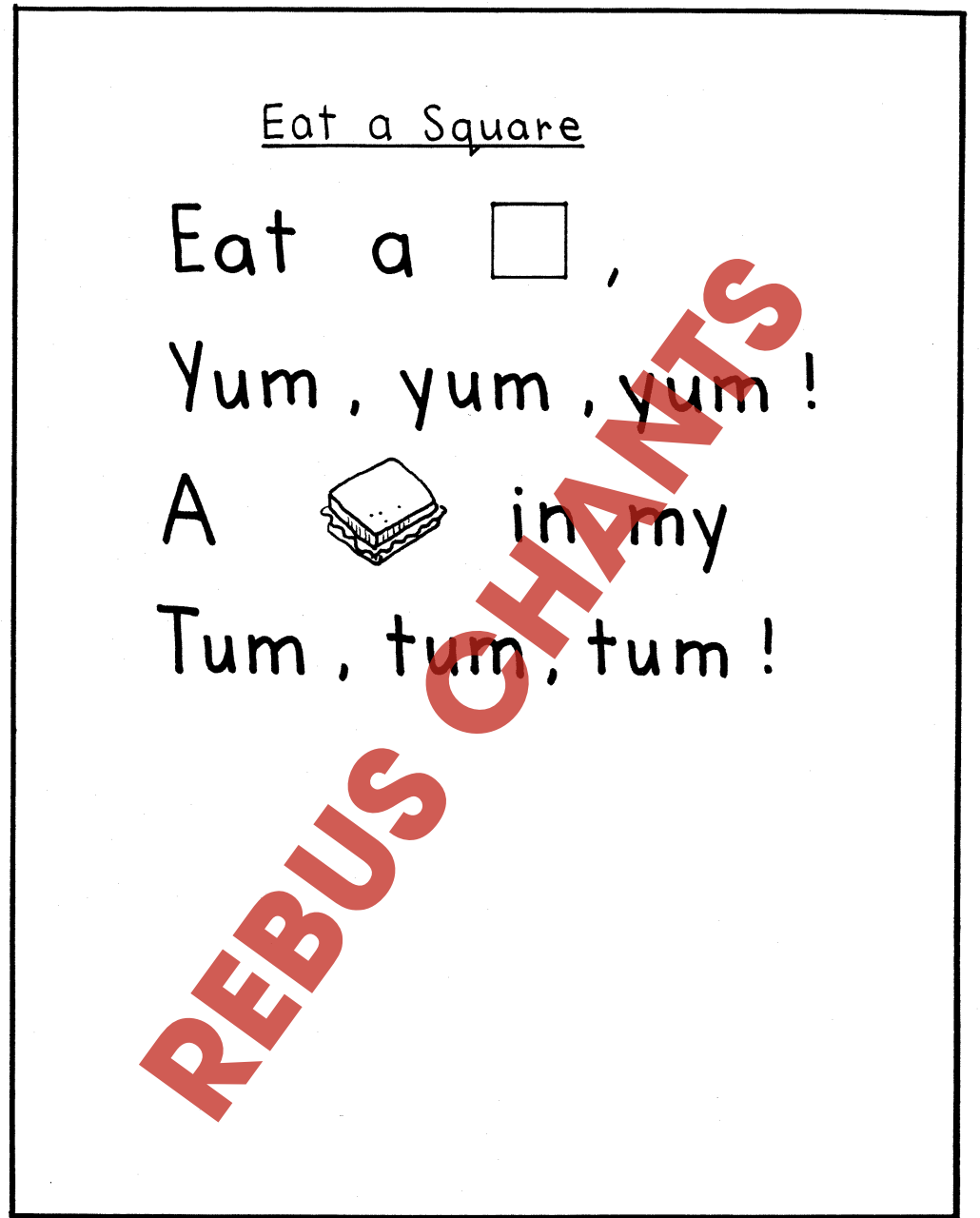
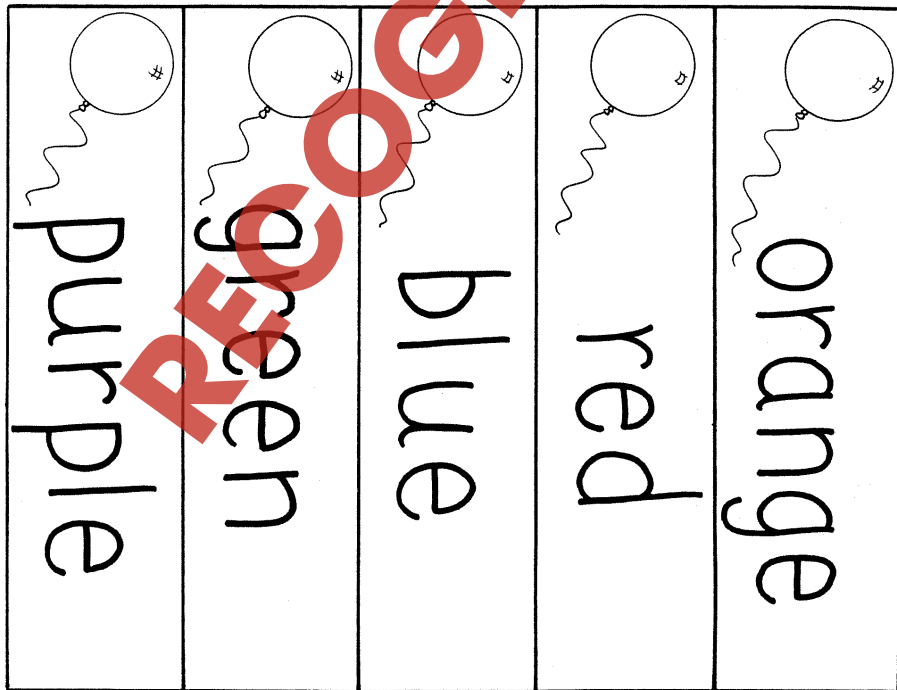
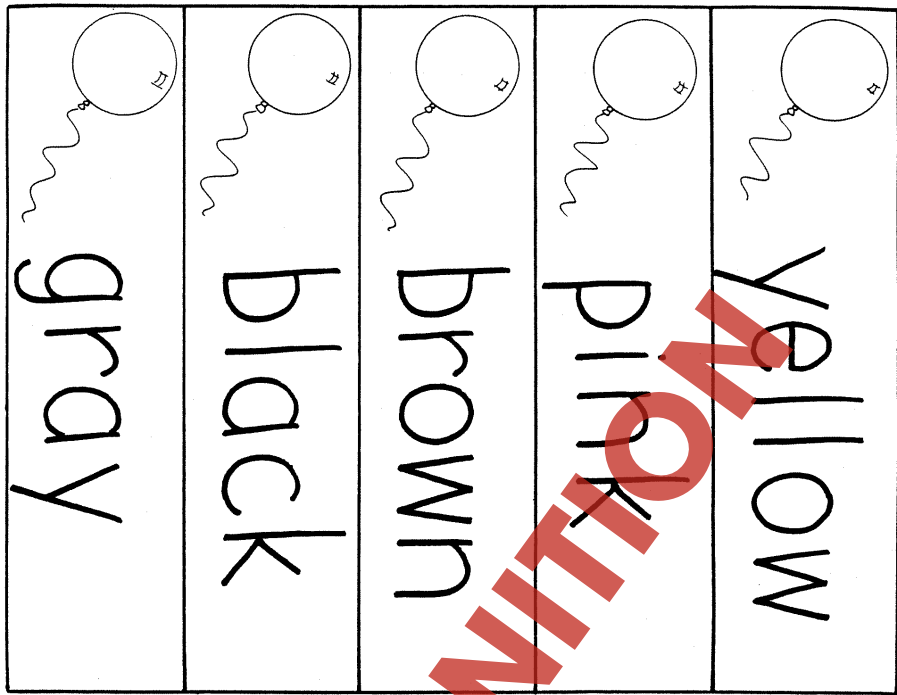
4. And so on.

Reading the Story

The story is about eating colours. As you read the story, the children will help you find the colour for Colour Bear to eat.

Explain that the dialogue balloons are what the bear is saying. The story is set up something like a comic book.

Story Based Activities

Class Discussion

What do the foods that Colour Bear eats have in common? They are all fruits. Is Colour Bear be a healthy bear? What kinds of food would Colour Bear eat if he were not a healthy bear?

Have you tasted all of the fruits in the story?

Little Books

Photocopy, cut, and staple. The children can draw something for the bear to eat.

For younger students, you can make this a cut and paste activity. Reduce and photocopy the fruit for the children to colour, cut, and paste into the little book.

Food Experience

Make a fruit salad with the fruit in the story.
