Four penguins are standing in a row. They are hungry!

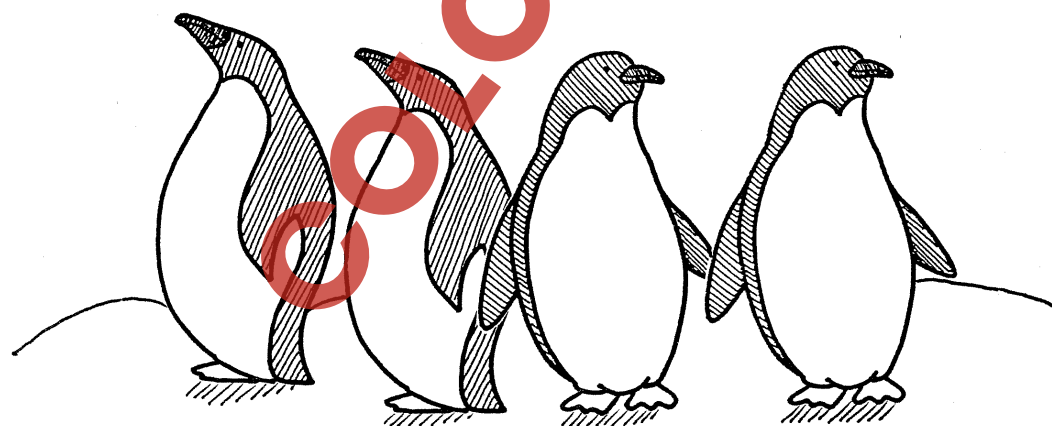
Draw a  in front of the first penguin.

Now all the penguins have something to eat. Colour the penguins and the food.

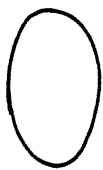

You can draw a penguin with simple shapes.

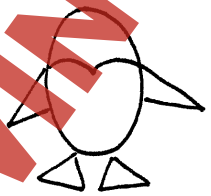
1. Draw an oval.



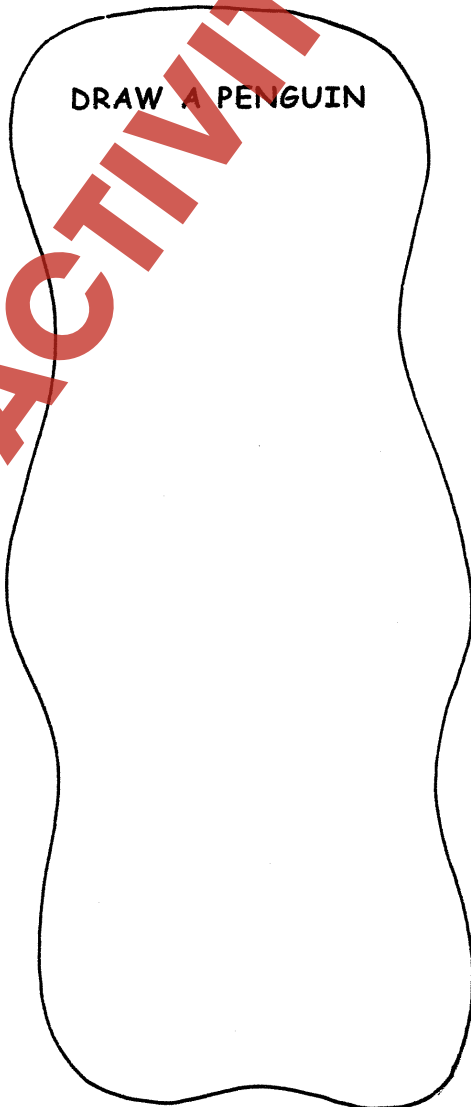
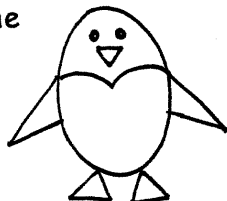
2. Draw triangles for the flippers and feet.



3. Draw a squiggle.



4. Draw a triangle for the beak and circles for the eyes.



DRAW A PENGUIN

at the bottom, blue. Cut out the pictures on the lines to give you four penguin pictures.

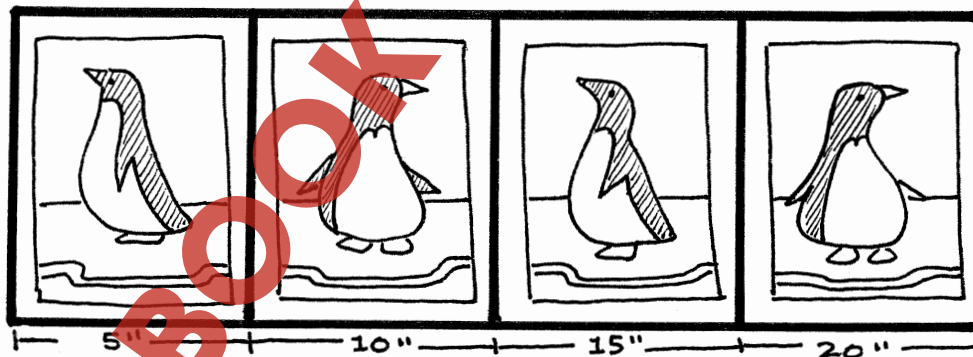
3. The picture of the penguins swimming is the last page of the book. Colour the penguins as before and colour the water blue.

4. Colour and cut out the cover picture. Set aside the pictures and text.

5. Cut the sheets into six, $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 20" strips. Set aside three of these strips. They are for the cover and the two back pages. Out of the remaining 3 strips, cut as follows:

- one $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5"
- one $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10"
- one $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 15"

6. Lay the pages on top of each other starting from the bottom. Start with the two 20" strips, then the 15" strip, the 10" strip, and the 5" strip. Set aside the remaining 20" strip for the cover. These are the pages of your big book. Glue the penguins onto the pages:



Glue the penguin pictures so they are evenly spaced. Now you can see how the book works: as you turn the pages, the penguins disappear.

7. Glue the picture of the penguins swimming on the last page.
