

Did You Say Dinosaurs ?

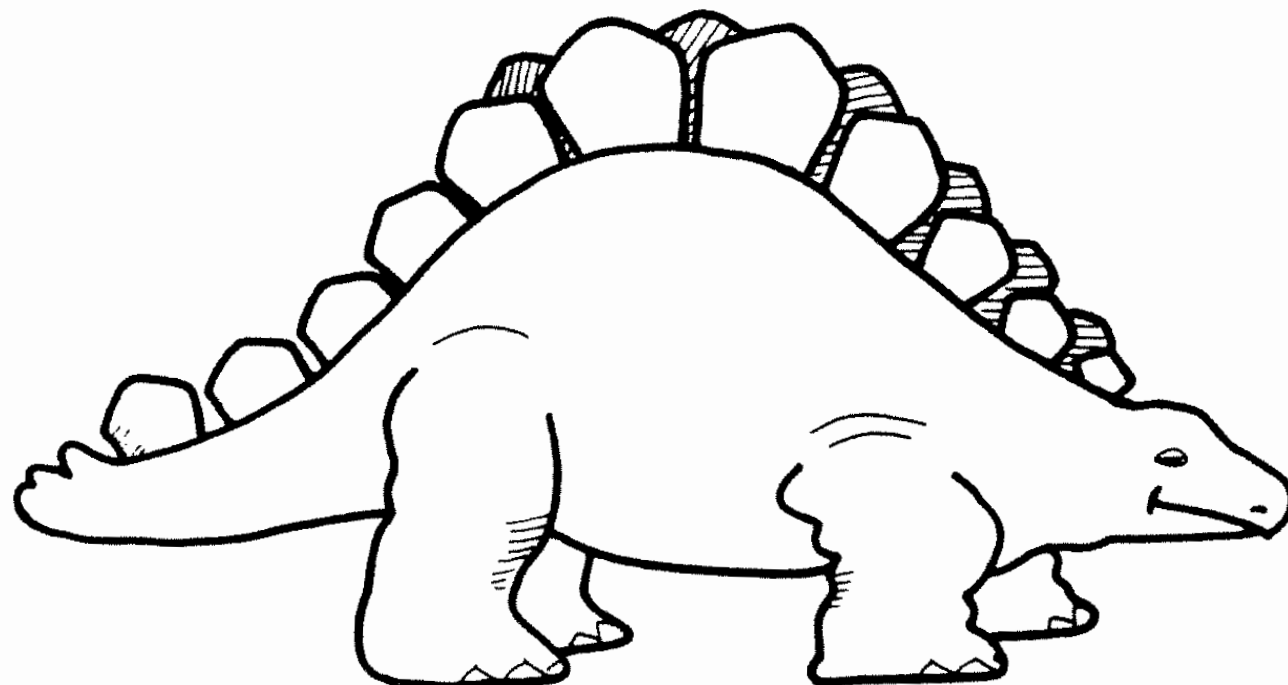
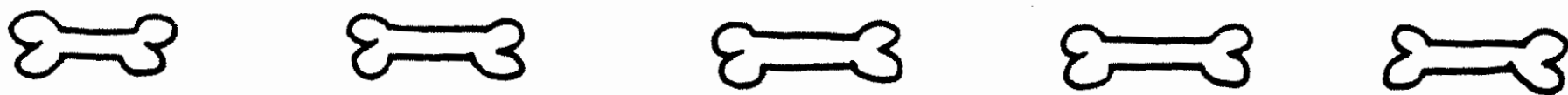
Welcome to the world of dinosaurs! Here you'll find workjobs and activities to make your Dinosaur Learning Center more complete.

Dinosaurs are a fascinating topic for children of all ages. Have fun exploring, discovering and creating!



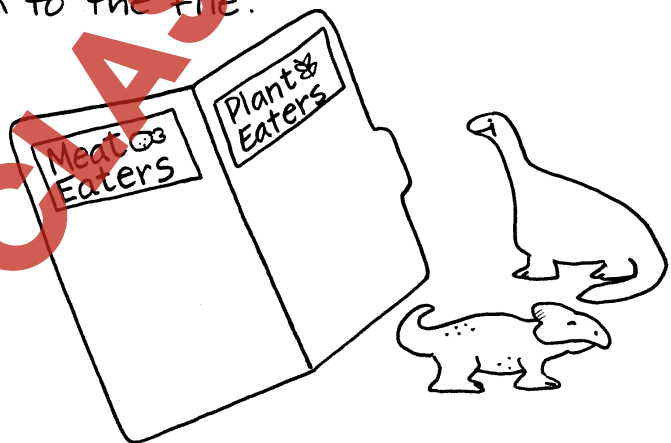
CLASSIFICATION

Meat Eaters, Plant Eaters

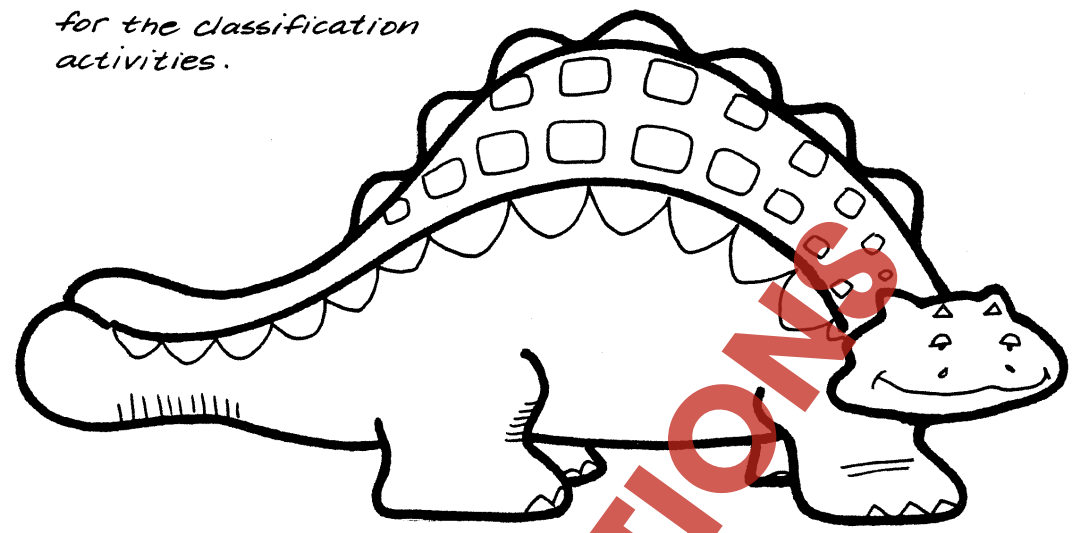
Student Objective : to classify plant eaters and meat eaters.

You'll need 1 legal size file folder (yellow), crayons, glue, scissors, a zipclose bag

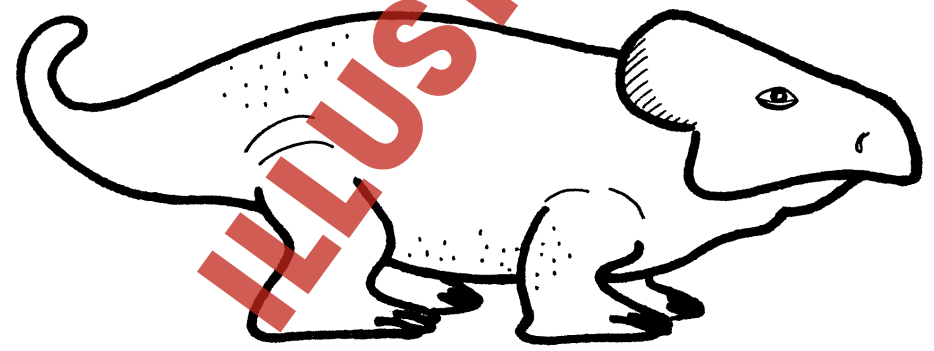
1. Duplicate the dinosaurs onto light green construction paper. Cut out and laminate. Or ... color the dinosaurs and mount on 2 ply bristol, cut out again leaving a ¼" bristol border.
2. Color and cutout title picture. Glue on the outside of the file.
3. Color and cut out the classification illustrations. Glue one on each side of the inside of the file. Laminate the file folder.
4. Store the dinosaurs in a zipclose bag. Attach to the file.

Ankylosaurus



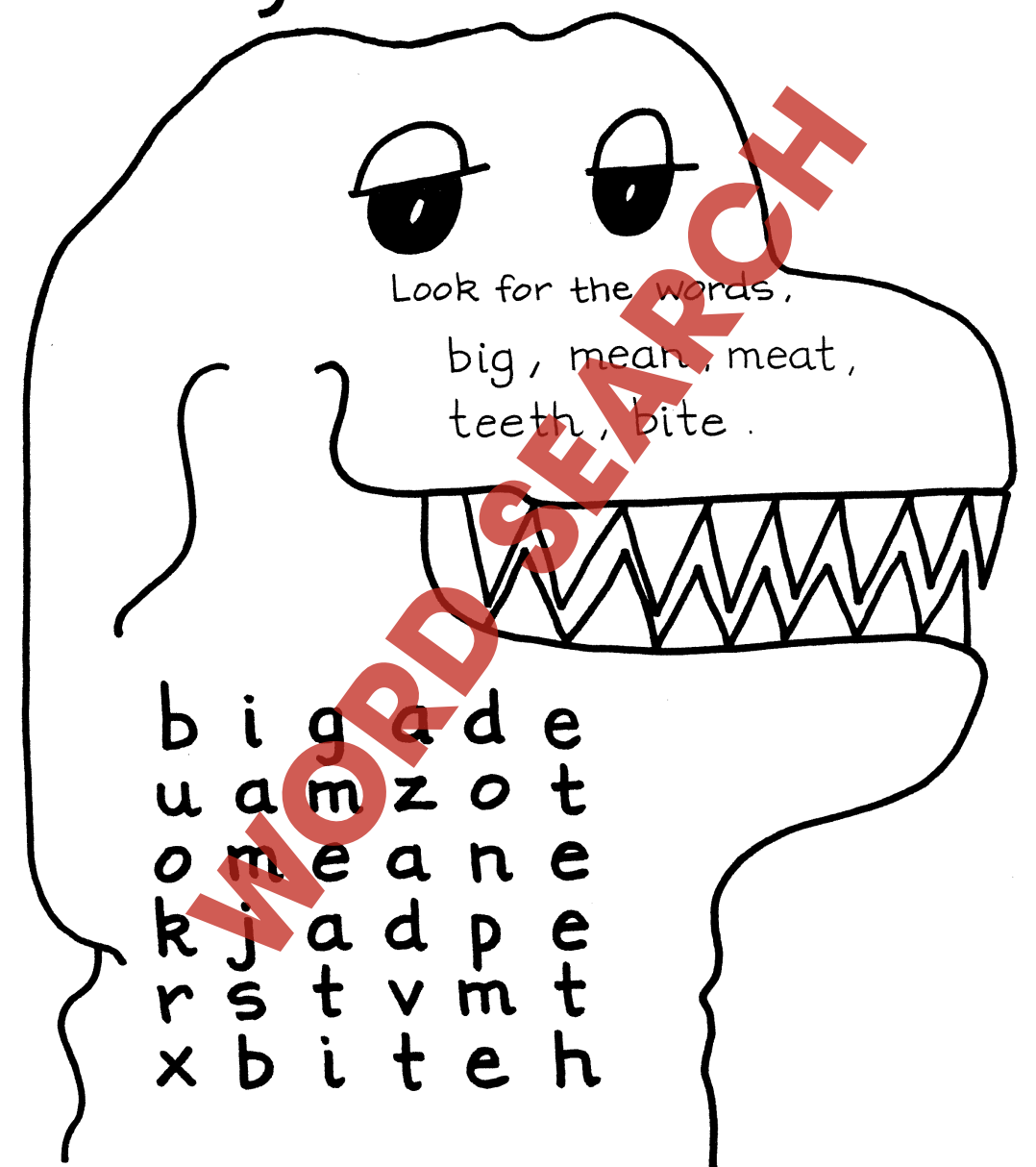
