
Let's Be Friends

Getting Acquainted Story and Songs Written and Illustrated by Vera Trembach


The story and songs included are about friendship. The songs are written to the tune of popular songs. They can be sung in a circle, joining hands and moving clockwise.

Friends, friends, friends we are. Together we are strong. We make a circle holding hands As we sing along.




Sing to the tune of Row, Row, Row Your Boan, joining hands to make a circle and moving counter clock wise.

Let's Be Friends Big Book


The story is about two children making friends. Hopefully, a stories like this , will help build bridges of friendship and understanding

How to Assemble:

Make a photocopy of each page and save your originals. Colour each page of illustrations making note of the following:

the boy is of Native ancestry and should be coloured accordingly with brown skin, brown eyes, and black hair.
 the girl has brown hair and green eyes.
 both children are wearing blue jeans.

Cut out the illustrations and the dialogue balloons. Assemble as follows, onto colourful 2-ply bristol pages that measure approximately 30 x 60 cm. You will need 8 pages, including the cover.



Laminate and bind.

Read the story to the class.

Follow up with a class discussion.

- 1. Explain the dialogue balloons. They represent what the character
- 2. Where does the story take place?
- 3. What is different about the two friends?
 - the skin colour is different.
 - the eyes are a different colour.
 - the hair is a different colour.
 - one is a boy and one is a girl
- 4. What is the same about the two friends?

 - they both go to school.
 they both wear blue jeans and a t-shirt.

 - they both have a pet.
 they both like to play ball
 they both have a shack made by someone they love.

As a culminating activity, each child in the class can make an introduction and say something about themselves. For example,

My name is Vera and I like to draw.

Make a list and brainstorm for things that we can do with a friend. Write the answers on a flip chart.


