




Hold the book in front of you and flip the pages forward from the back of the book

Student objective


- 1. Student will sort the rain forest facts under true or false

Copies

Photocopy the cards and headers on a variety of coloured bond paper.

How to set up

Glue the instruction card on the outside of the file folder. Glue the file folder pictures inside the file folder. Glue a large manilla envelope on the back side after laminating, to hold the sorting pieces.

Optional Class activity

Set up the headers in a pocket chart.

Ask the class to help you sort the facts. Use a pocket chart for sorting. This is an opportunity to discuss each fact and learn about the rain forest.

Play a game. Divide the class in two. Shuffle and stack the rain forest cards. Draw a card and read the fact on the card. The first team to shout the correct answer receives a point.

Student will put the leaf-puzzle together.


Copying
