
STUDENT SKILLS AND OBJECTIVES


HANDS ON ACTIVITY Can you help Kathryn clean up her room?

Colour and cut out the pieces. Mount on a bristo backing and laminate. Store in a zipclose bag at a Learning Centre.

HANDS ON ACTIVITY - Story Sequencing

Photocopy the story onto a coloured bond paper, omitting the title page. Add the instructions at the bottom of the cover page. Reduce by 64% on the photocopier for a smaller activity. Mount each page onto a two ply bristol backing. Laminate.

INSTRUCTION CARD

READING THE STORY

Cover the title of the story and ask students to guess what the story is about. Read the story orally to the class. Read again, looking for new things in the illustrations.

- 1. What does the spider web tell us
- 2. Can you find the little mouse in each picture?

ORAL DISCUSSION

- 1. Why should the girl in the story keep her room clean?
- 2. What are the benefit of keeping tidy and clean?
- 3. What does it mean to be grounded? Why would the girl get grounded?
- 4. What could the girl in the story do to tidy up her room?
- 5. Discuss the exaggeration in the story. Did her room really look like a garbage dump? Did it really look like a pigpen?

CLASS STUDY

Discuss household cleaners. Discuss the labels on the cleaners and what they mean. Never touch household cleaners without permission from a parent.



Award the Classroom Helper certificate to each student for participation. Photocopy the certificate page onto coloured bond paper and cut in half.


